

Important Notice About Mass Times

Our sister parish in Trenton has asked for an adjustment in the Sunday Mass schedule. With only one priest serving both parishes, the Mass times must be such that Father can cover them all, also allowing for travel time. The current Mass schedule is 10 am at Our Lady of Sorrows and 12 pm at Holy Name of Jesus. The change is intended to stand for many years to come, therefore, we hope even those who are sequestering due to COVID will take note and participate. The proposed change would have Our Lady of Sorrows shift the Sunday Mass to 11 am and Holy Name of Jesus Sunday Mass would move to 9 am. No other Mass times would be involved. According to pre-COVID numbers, Our Lady of Sorrows serves 650 to 700 families; Holy Name of Jesus serves about 300. Since OLOS parishioners are the greater number of people affected, our goal is to learn your preference in this matter. The OLOS Parish Council is asking that you answer one question based on how this will impact you and your Sunday morning:

Yes, change the Mass time at OLOS to 11:00 am. No, leave the Mass at OLOS at 10:00 am.

You will be given an opportunity to "vote" starting the weekend of January 23-24. We are inviting all adult or confirmed parishioners to express their opinion. Instructions on how to "vote" will be given later, but you will be able to "vote" through email, text messaging, a paper ballot, or a phone call. This should allow those sheltering in place due to COVID to participate. All "voting" will be completed by the end of January.

Keep up the great work Rosary Makers! *Dear Chuck Mitchell and Our Lady's Rosary Makers*,

Greetings from Bishop's House, Kohima, Nagaland, Northeast India. First of all, I want to inform you that the packet of rosaries you sent reached me today (Dec. 15, 2020). I thank you all very sincerely for the rosaries which I distribute during my pastoral visits. The Covid-19 infection rate is very high in India, but in Nagaland the number of infections is less than 50 a day. But we need to take care. As you know from the news, India is going through a difficult time. The strike by the farmers is on the 20th day. Therefore we need more prayers and special grace from God through the intercession of Our Lady, so that our secular nature of the constitution is preserved and lived. Kindly thank all your collaborators for the great help and service they do for the missions. Looking forward to your constant support and prayers. With all best wishes and prayers,
