

Ash Wednesday 2021

Both of our Ash Wednesday liturgies include the distribution of ashes. On Wednesday, February 17, we will have a Liturgy of the Word with distribution of ashes and Holy Communion at 12:15 pm and a Mass at 7:00 pm. The blessing and distribution of ashes to the faithful on Ash Wednesday will takes place in the following way: The Priest or Deacon will bless the ashes and sprinkle them with holy water. Priest or Deacon will address all present and only once say:

"Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return," applying it to the assembly. The Priest, deacon or lay minister will sprinkle ashes on the head of each person who comes forward without saying anything. The wearing of ashes, while customary and laudable, is not an obligation of the faithful, so anyone who is fearful of becoming sick should not come forward, or even come to Mass on Ash Wednesday. Masks must be worn by everyone during the distribution of ashes. Ashes may not be self-imposed: they are always given by a minister.
