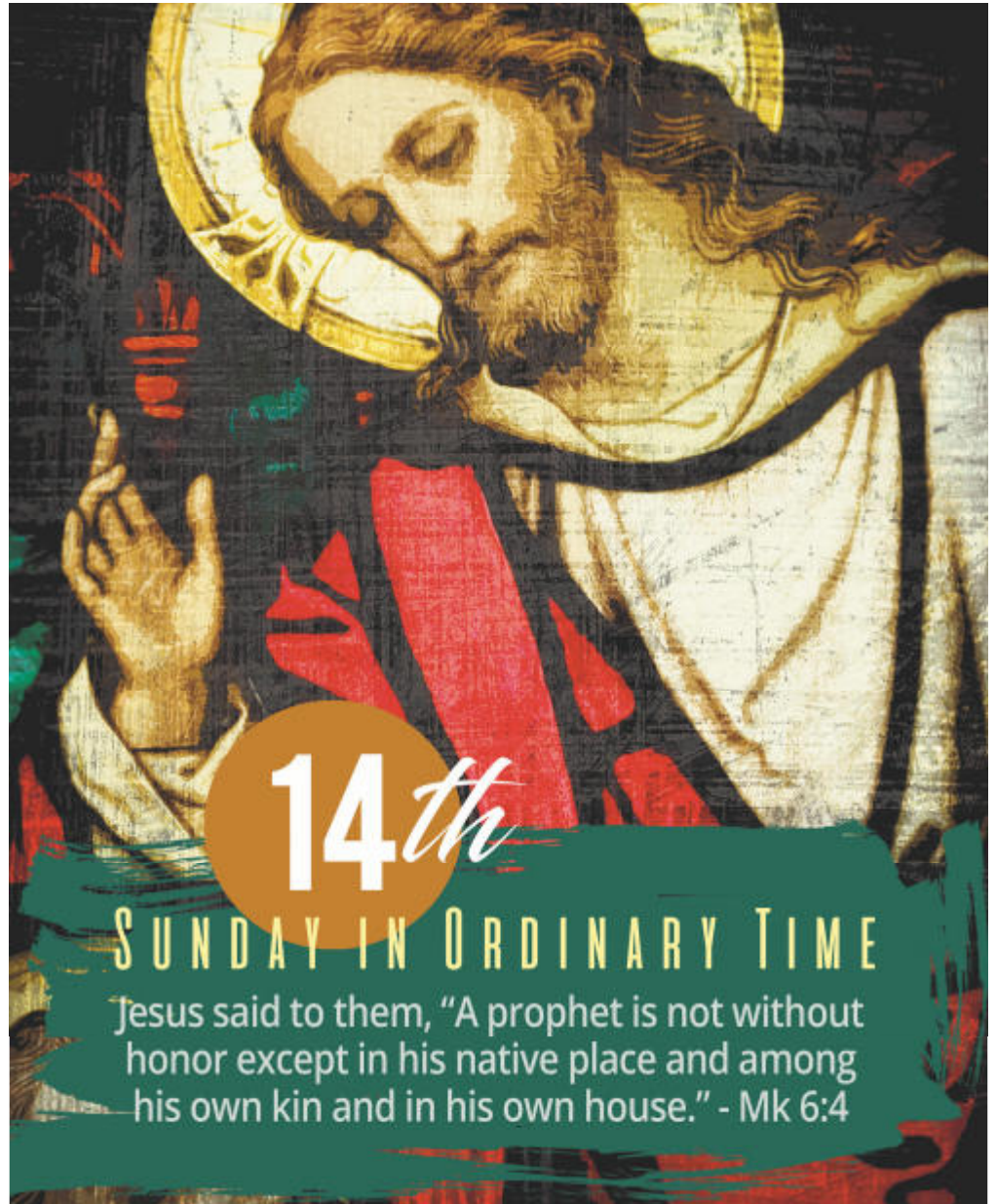

Guidelines for Worship from the Archdiocese of Cincinnati Revised 6/2/21

The Bishops of Ohio have restored the general obligation to attend Mass on Sunday and Holy Days. Those who are ill, have significant health risk factors or care for someone who is compromised or ill, are not obligated to attend Mass in-person on Sunday and Holy Days as well as those who have significant fear or anxiety of contracting the coronavirus in a large group of people. These should observe the Lord's Day and are encouraged to spend time in prayer on Sunday, meditating on the Lord's passion, death and resurrection. An appropriate way to do this is through viewing a broadcast of Sunday Mass. **NOTE: Mass that is broadcast through various media, including livestream, is not intended as an alternative nor does it fulfill the obligation for persons who are able to gather for a Sunday celebration and other Holy Days. They are intended for the sick, homebound, imprisoned etc. who are unable to attend Mass in person.**

No Monday Morning Mass July 5th

This Monday, our offices will be closed and we will not have our usual 8:30 am Mass. Daily Mass will be held as usual on Tuesday morning at 8:30 am, followed by Eucharistic Exposition from 9:00 to 10:00.

Worship Space Update

In the Church, we are no longer monitoring seat spacing and masks are optional for those who have been vaccinated. Hand sanitizer is available. Eucharistic Ministers will no longer wear masks. More chairs have been added, and kneelers, hymnals and hymnal holders have returned. For those who would prefer to practice social distancing, the PAC is still set up for that purpose, provided the PAC wi-fi is working. The Daily Mass Chapel is also available for overflow seating. The weekend of August 1 will be the last weekend for both live streaming and worship aids. Live streaming could continue if we can find enough volunteers to take over the tasks - so if you are tech-savvy and able to help, please call the parish office. Worship aids could continue if we can negotiate an upgrade to a copier that can fold the copies. Our target date for having the PAC ready to use as a Worship Space is mid-August - the first weekend of September at the latest. **If you know a painter with workers' compensation coverage who could repaint the PAC, please contact Ava in the parish office.** We are proceeding as quickly as possible with the "churchification" of the sanctuary and the sound system in the PAC.

This is the culmination of our Seeds for Growth project, when we give thanks for a successful harvest with a day of fun, Mass, dinner and basket raffles. More details to follow.
