

Masses for Palm Sunday, Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Easter, and the Vigil

The principal feasts beginning with Palm Sunday and concluding with the Lord's Resurrection on Easter constitute the holiest days of the Church's year and are commonly referred to as "Holy Week." Covid-19's impact on our Church celebrations will continue on our Holy Week celebrations. While all these celebrations will be livestreamed, I wanted to let you know about what we will do to insure as safe an environment as possible during these celebrations so that you will know what to expect should you choose to attend in person.

At all celebrations we encourage everyone to maintain social distancing and to wear a face covering.

Palm Sunday: Palms will be distributed as usual. This year, ushers who have sanitized their hands will distribute palms as you enter church or the Parish Hall/PAC. The Gospel describing the entry of Jesus into Jerusalem will be read and the prayer blessing the palms will be read. Then the deacon will go to the Parish Hall/PAC and Father to the church to sprinkle the people and palms with Holy Water. Mass with reading of the Passion will then continue as is normal. Blessed palms will be available throughout the week.

Holy Thursday: Due to space considerations and the need for social distancing, The Holy Thursday Mass of the Lord's Supper will be moved to Our Lady of Sorrows this year. The parts of this celebration of the Last Supper are still in planning, however, we can say that we will still conduct the traditional washing of feet of parishioners from both parishes. There will also be the presentation of the Sacramental Oils of the Sick, of Catechumens and of the Infirm which the Archbishop blesses on Tuesday of Holy Week. And there will be the traditional procession with the Eucharist to a place of reposition before the church is stripped in anticipation of Good Friday.

Good Friday: This celebration will be the least changed of the services. The veneration of the cross is the only part which demands adjustments due to covid-19. Veneration of the cross cannot be done with the traditional kissing of the cross as there is no reasonable way to sanitize between each veneration. Therefore, persons coming forward to venerate the cross are asked to make a sign of reverence that does not involve touching the cross. One may genuflect or bow while making the sign of the cross as an appropriate gesture of reverence.

The Easter Vigil: We anticipate numbers of people in church to be lighter than normal as there are no persons entering the Church at either parish, as well as the reduced numbers caused by covid-19. However, the size of the crowd will determine whether we will use individual candles or not. We will gather in the parking lot (weather permitting) for the blessing of the Easter Fire. There will be no Baptisms or Confirmations this year, so the Vigil will be somewhat shorter than in other years.

Easter: Easter Mass will be as usual, except for the reduced capacity in the church. The Parish Hall/PAC will be set up to allow as many as possible to be accommodated with social distancing. Live streams are also available for both churches. Please call the office at Holy Name of Jesus if you would like to information on Live Streamed Mass there for viewing at home.

The "Year B" Readings

The readings we hear every Sunday follow a three-year rotation. In Year A we hear primarily from Matthew's Gospel; in Year B, from Mark; and in Year C, from Luke. John's Gospel is interspersed throughout each year. On the Third, Fourth and Fifth Sundays of Lent, the readings from Year A are used when there are those in the parish who are preparing for Baptism (the "Elect") at the Easter Vigil. These three Year A readings from John's Gospel (the woman and the well; the man born blind; the raising of Lazarus) are one of the oldest sets of readings used specifically for the preparation of those about to be baptized. They closely parallel the conversion journey toward baptism and powerfully convey the importance of faith in Christ as the mark of readiness to follow his way. In our parishes this year, we do not have Elect who will be baptized at the Easter Vigil. Because of this, we will be using the Year B readings for the Third, Fourth and Fifth Sundays of Lent.

Confessions During Lent

Confessions at Our Lady of Sorrows are usually available on the first and third Wednesdays of the month from 6:30 to 7:00 pm or by appointment. During Lent, confessions at Our Lady of Sorrows will be Wednesday, March 17 and Tuesday, March 23 in the Daily Mass Chapel. Confessions at Holy Name of Jesus are usually available on the second and fourth Wednesdays of the month from 6:30 to 7:00 pm or by appointment. During Lent, confessions at Holy Name of Jesus will be this Wednesday, March 10, Tuesday, March 16 and Wednesday, March 24 in the Parish Hall.

Storytime Session


