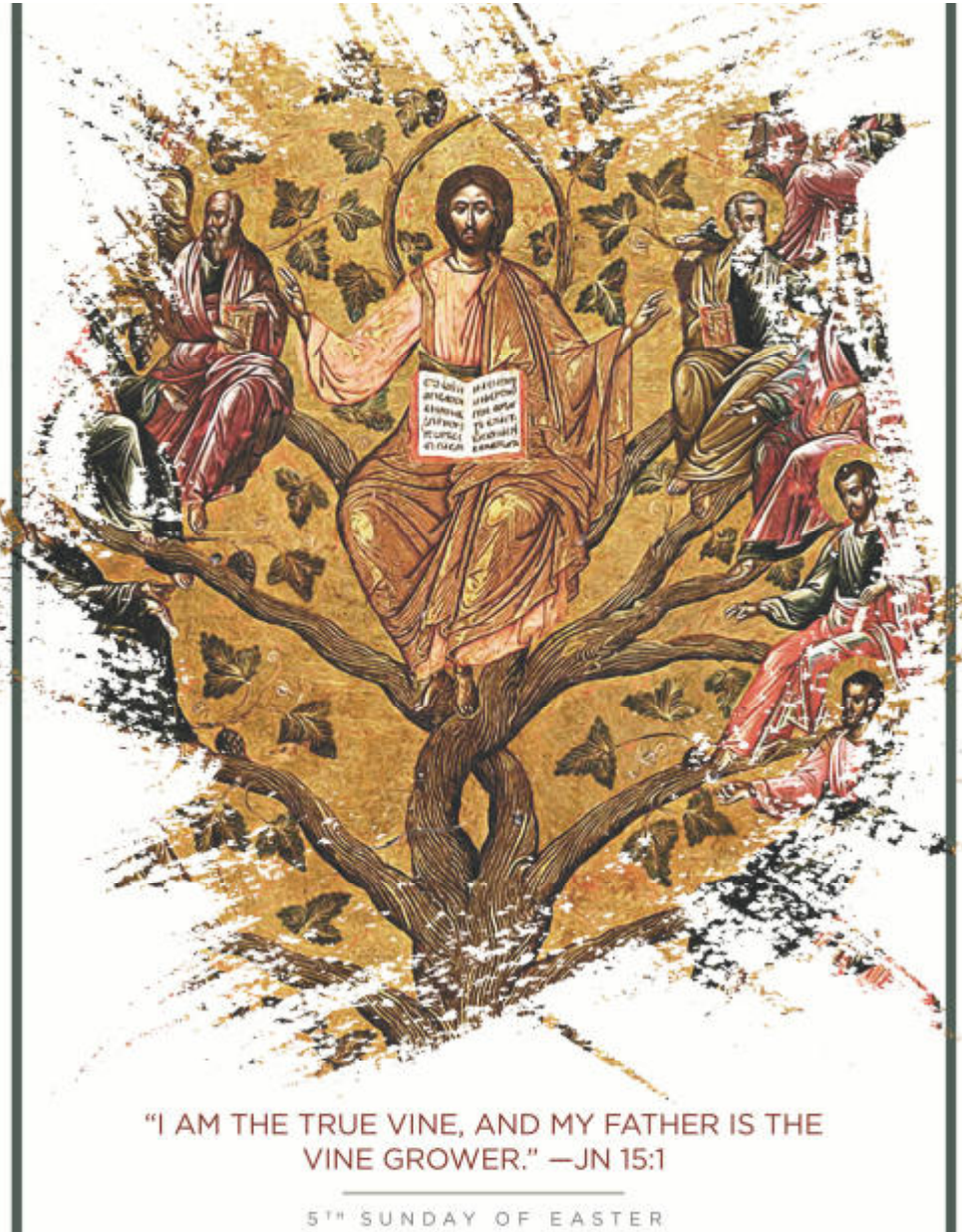

The pilgrimage will start at Russell's Point, in the northern part of the diocese, on May 16th, 2021 and crisscross its way throughout the entire archdiocese, finishing at the Cathedral Basilica of St. Peter in Chains on June 19th, 2021. Each day the pilgrims will take a statue of Our Lady of Fatima to a different location. There will also be larger, family-friendly events hosted throughout the archdiocese.

Pope Francis has called living out God's mercy "the beating heart of the Gospel." Archdiocesan Bicentennial and Marian Consecration
