From the Pastor's Desk



Which Mass Should We Go To?!?

When a pastoral region experiences a loss of a priest and therefore a reduction in Mass times, one of the difficulties created for nearly all persons and families is that the fewer Sunday Masses offered at the parish (in our cases, now 2 at each parish) aren't offered at times that are always convenient. Fortunately for us we are in an area where there are other parishes within 15 or 20 minutes drivetime that offer a range of Mass times. "But Father, I don't want to join that parish." You don't have to. The structuring of the church today allows us to be a member of any parish we want while living wherever we want. Church law still requires that each diocese be divided into parishes with set boundaries. Whatever parish's boundaries you happen to live in is obligated by church law to provide for your sacramental needs. But you do not have to claim it as your parish. You can be a registered member of a parish 2 counties over if you like. While the reduction of Mass times due to the shortage of priests may force you to attend Sunday Mass at a church other than the one you claim as your parish, you can still belong to your preferred parish. I hope most of our people will make this choice and attend our parishes as much as they can and continue to participate in our activities and support our parishes. These parishes are our parishes until we choose otherwise.

Veterans Day



Veteran's Day

In World War I, the fighting ceased when a temporary cessation of hostilities between the Allied nations and Germany went into effect on the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month of 1918. In November 1919, President Wilson proclaimed November 11 as the first commemoration of Armistice Day. The original concept was a day observed with parades, public meetings and a brief suspension of business beginning at 11 am. In 1938, the 11th of November in each year was made a legal holiday - a day to be dedicated to world peace and to be known as "Armistice Day." In 1954, after World War II and Korea, "Armistice" Day was changed to "Veterans" Day and it became a day to honor American veterans of all wars. The Uniform Holiday Bill in 1968 made Veterans Day into a "Monday Holiday" beginning in 1971 - a change undone in 1978. Now Veterans Day is observed on November 11, regardless of the day of the week on which it falls. This restoration to November 11 not only preserves the historical significance of the date, **but helps focus attention on the purpose of the day - to honor America's veterans for their patriotism, love of country, and willingness to serve and sacrifice for the common good.**
