

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP Everyday Saints

Growing up I thought saints were larger than life people with extraordinary stories. The thought that I could one day be revered as a saint by anyone seemed crazy. I wrote my essays on different saints every year in Catholic school right around All Saints Day. These were stories about people I had never met, and I assumed I would never meet anyone like them going forward. Now that I am older, I realize that I was wrong back then and my immaturity of both mind and heart did not allow me to see that there are saints among us all the time. I have met many people in my life that I would call living saints. They are holy people who give of themselves to God and others in profound ways. Their relationship with Jesus is evident and they live their lives in ways that people witness the transformative power of love.

As a child I was wrong about saints, but even more importantly, I didn't fully realize that all of us are called to be saints! Me, a saint? Holiness is not something simply studied in books. It is the way of life we are all called to live. The call comes from Jesus Christ and each of us must respond. If we are still thinking like children, we may choose to stay silent and live accordingly. If we are more mature in our faith then we might not only respond, we might one day have a school child write a report about us. The truth is, the modern world increasingly seems to have no real idea what love is or how to determine when love is real. That makes the seemingly simple words of Jesus about loving God and your neighbor very complex indeed. How can you love God with your all your heart, soul, and mind when you have no idea what the act of loving means? And then, what constitutes loving a neighbor? To make it more complicated, Jesus commands you to love them like you love yourself. I bet you can agree with me that there are a lot of people out there who do not even come close to loving themselves. Knowing what love is in modern times is just not that easy. How is a well-meaning person able to find out the true meaning of love?



Collection for Thanksgiving Food Begins This Weekend!

Our Lady of Sorrows Parish will again assist with other area churches and organizations to help support Choice Pantry of Middletown during November and December. Last year we aided over 30 families and would like to help just as many this year. The service region for Middletown Choice Pantry includes families in Monroe and those as far south as Le Sourdsville and the intersection of Rt 4 and Rt 747. Restrictions during COVID are forcing us to change some of our traditions this year. Parishioners can help by donating money for holiday turkeys and hams. Beginning this weekend, you can drop money off in the collection bin in the Gathering Space until December 13th. Students in our Sunday School will also be collecting food items.

November Toy Drive

The Our Lady of Sorrows Knights of Columbus are sponsoring a Toy Drive to benefit the Community Pregnancy Center. They have requested unwrapped toys for babies and smaller toddlers (ages 0 – 3 years old). There will be collection boxes in the Gathering Space and lobby of the PAC. The Toy Drive will run from Saturday, October 31st to Sunday, November 29th. The Knights will deliver the donated toys to the Community Pregnancy Center in early December so that the toys can be distributed before Christmas. We encourage everyone in the Parish to participate in this Toy Drive.

Annual Report to Parish The Annual Report is still available in the Gathering Space and is posted on the parish website. The change in format shows how we were doing before and after COVID came into play. Like many in our community, the parish has been affected financially. Because we were doing well before COVID, we ended the year with a surplus, despite posting a substantial deficit for the last quarter of the fiscal year.

Collections

7 months into the pandemic, Our Lady of Sorrows is experiencing a substantial downturn in collections. Even as Mass attendance has gone up a little in September and October, collections continue to be much lower than what we experienced pre-COVID. We know that this is partly due to parishioners experiencing real financial hardship brought on by the pandemic. If you are able to give, please consider setting up electronic contributions. This is a safe and easy way to support your parish and you don't need to bring your envelope to Mass or mail in your contributions. The form is in the Gathering Space and on the parish website. Once set up, it is very easy to change the amount or to suspend contributions just by calling Bob in the office. Or consider setting up regular payments through your bank or banking app. This is typically a no-cost way to set up contributions. Your bank will mail a check directly to Our Lady of Sorrows at whatever frequency you choose. Please call Ava in the parish office if you have questions.
