

When and How to Move Forward

When and how to move forward, that consideration has caused me no end of consternation since May. Like any good American, my first impulse was to take action, to make a plan, to do something as soon as the barriers were removed and we could move around again. Something I've realized with every plan and way forward I've considered, and some I've even started to act on, is that the parish is not like corporate America. Corporate America takes stock of its resources, the demand for its product and its present ability to deliver that product (even if the product is a service) and then decides if there is a way to make enough money to weather the present storm (or even make a profit) under the given circumstances. That's an oversimplification, but it puts us in the ballpark. For corporate America, having the personnel is a question of resources. They often reshuffle whatever people they have. They replace worn out or ineffective ones for new prospects. And sometimes they decide they can't get the right people at the right price to stay in business. The parish isn't like this at all. We are communities. Our people are essential parts of our definition, "the Body of Christ gathered in this area". We can't "move forward" until and unless we can gather the community and move forward together. The corona virus is almost like a flood that has left many parts of our communities cutoff and isolated. The Archdiocese's new round of regional planning adds its own set of downpours to the floodwaters. We won't know how intact the communities are until the flood recedes and we can gather everyone again. What do we do until then? We do the best we can. We can try to do what we've always done, adapting what we've been doing to work under Covid restrictions. Some things will work, like smaller gatherings that can be social distanced. Other things are just too risky, like gathering larger groups in spaces that can't provide social distancing. Any new initiatives will need to be looked at on a case by case basis. As I mentioned earlier, my plan for the parishes has two parts. One part is to not make any plans beyond what we always do until our situation is more settled and certain and we can draw our communities together again. It isn't what I want to do, but it seems the prudent course that avoids wasted time planning for what may or may not be, and what our communities may or may not look like. The other part is to continue to pray for the wellbeing of our people and the communities as a whole, and the guidance of the Holy Spirit. I hope you will join me in this last part, if you haven't already.


