From the Pastor's Desk



Pastoral Regions and Closing Parishes

In this article I will address two questions, how did we get into a Pastoral Region in the first place? And will “they” close my parish? I’ll answer the second one first because it is the shorter of the two, I think.

In one sense, I don’t know if “they” will close your parish. I highly doubt it. This would be a dramatic change from how things have happened in the last 30 years. For the most part, parishes have not been closed by the Archbishop or the Archdiocese. The few that have been closed or consolidated with other parishes came at the request of the parishes themselves. This was most often due to the parishes involved being no longer viable on their own. Rarely, two parishes have realized that they can become a strong community together, much stronger than they are separately, and they choose to merge. Never have two parishes, each feeling they are vital and self-sufficient, opted to merge. Under the new regional planning process, some of this may change and there may be greater encouragement for communities to look toward merging rather than waiting until the last possible moment. That remains to be seen. In 2005 (roughly) the Archdiocese, after realizing that within just a few years there would no longer be enough active pastors to staff all the parishes in the Archdiocese, undertook a planning process to formulate a plan to address the situation. The present Pastoral Regions are result of that plan. The idea was to divide the parishes so that each pastoral region would have roughly 1500 to 2000 families. These pastoral regions were also formed with an eye toward geographical proximity. In our case the boundaries of the three parishes touch each other and the numbers of Catholic families served by the three parishes of Holy Name of Jesus, Our Lady of Sorrows and Holy Family combined are about 2000 families. Whatever similarities or differences the three parishes have, they at least meet those two requirements.
