

Beacons of Light

What is the parish church? The answer to that question depends greatly on what era of the church you are discussing and what part of the world you are in. In the early days of Christianity, the local "parish" was usually a home of a leading parishioner where the community gathered for the celebration of the Lord's Supper, to receive instruction in the faith, to gain encouragement in remaining faithful and find out the latest news about fellow parishioners and the church in other parts of the Roman Empire. In 19th Century Europe, the parish church was the dispenser of the Sacraments to the faithful, while at the same time in the United States, the parish church was often the social center for immigrants to learn the language and customs of their new country, find out who was hiring, make friends in the new land, gain an education for their children and find a refuge from an American society that was often anti-Catholic. And the parish still dispensed the Sacraments of the Church.

That definition of the American parish was generally true through 1960 and may still be true in some isolated pockets of the country. For our area and for many parts of the country, this definition just doesn't fit lived experience of Catholic people – of us. Today, we Catholics are Americanized, so much that if we lack anything it may be that we aren't "Catholicized" enough. As our Archbishop looks to address a future where fewer priests will be available to pastor parishes, he also sees that in other parts of the country, the trends that plague Catholic practice are not issues at all.

Beacons of Light seeks to address these two concerns as symptoms of a common root issue. That is, a lack of the needed vocations to staff parishes and a general lack of Catholic fervor both point to a Catholic people whose practice of faith is without a clear direction and purpose. What should we be about? Should we be about anything? Shouldn't we just leave it to someone more educated and "churchy"? As Beacons of Light unfolds, we hope to answer and put to rest these questions and in doing so, find a new sense of direction and purpose that will help us become Catholics who understand our mission to carry Christ wherever we go and to be a reflection of Jesus and his Church to whomever we meet. You can read more about the initial stages of Beacons of Light from the one-page flier available at the doors of church or on the parish website near the bulletin link. You will also be hearing more about Beacons of Light as the program advances.

Eucharistic Adoration



Eucharistic Adoration is a centuries old ritual and falls within a broader category of devotions and rituals that are associated with the

Sacrament of the Eucharist. Eucharistic Adoration is an extension of the worship and adoration of the Blessed Sacrament that occurs in every Mass. On Tuesday morning after Mass, a one-hour period of **Eucharistic Adoration is held in** Church that ends with "benediction," the blessing of the faithful with the Blessed Sacrament. Although adoration of the Blessed Sacrament can never take the place of Eucharistic Communion, many Catholics find great comfort and consolation in their prayers before the Eucharist when it is exposed in the monstrance during Eucharistic Adoration or in the tabernacle in our Blessed Sacrament Chapel (both are equally valid, as the Christ is not more present in one than in the other). But when we consider our eucharistic devotions, it is always important to remember the fundamental connection these acts of devotion have the celebration of the Eucharist in the Mass and reception of Christ in Communion.


