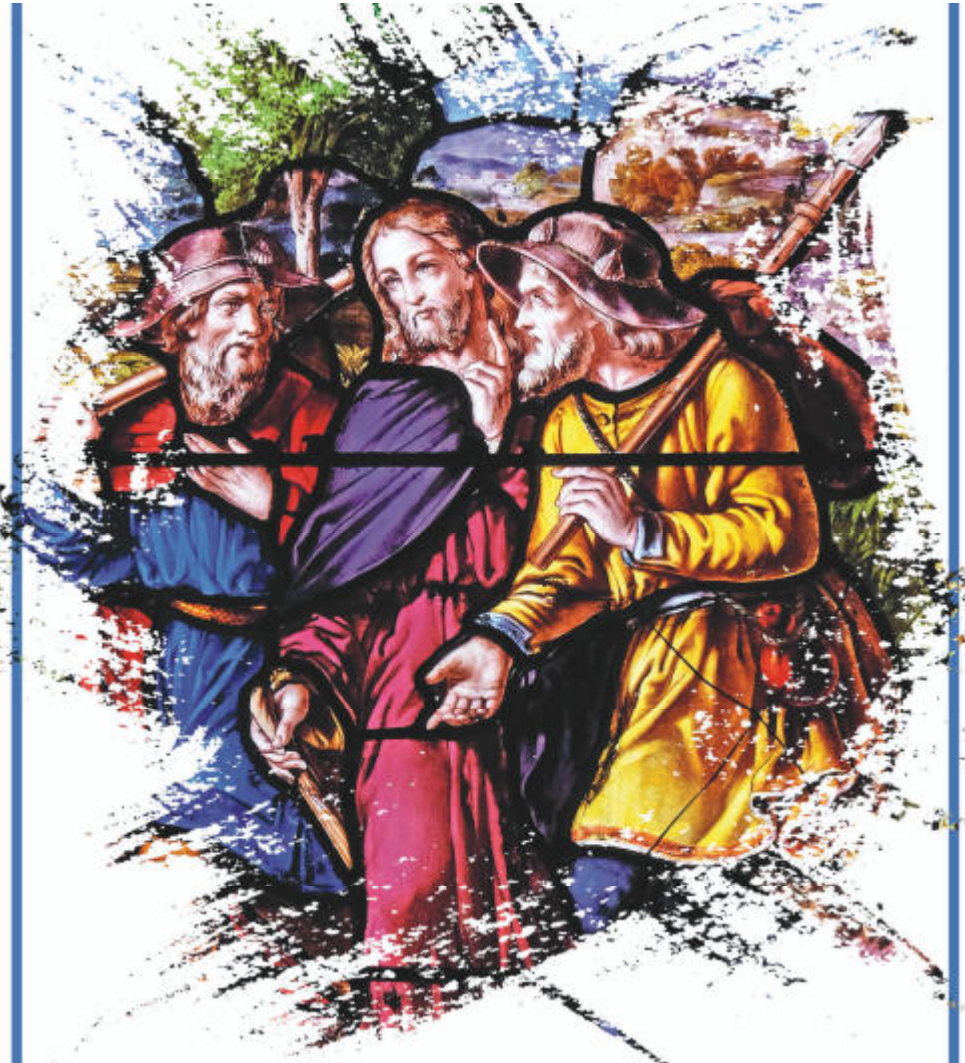

On September 19th the Church celebrates Catechetical Sunday. This celebration is an opportunity for all of us to reflect the role that each person plays, by virtue of the sacrament of Baptism, in transmitting the faith and being a witness to the Gospel - particularly parents. The theme for this year, as established by the United States Conference of Bishops, is "Say the Word and My Soul Shall be Healed." The past year has highlighted our need for healing, be that physical, spiritual, or emotional. While our world may struggle to meet all those needs fully and completely, Jesus our Divine Physician makes the impossible possible. When we pray during Mass, "say the word and my soul shall be healed," we can be reminded of the healing power Jesus offers through Eucharist and his Word. Handing on our faith to others, both in word and deed, can be healing not just for those receiving His Word, but for us as well. We should call on Jesus, Our Divine Physician, to give us the courage, strength, and zeal, to carry out this task rooted in truth, love, and grace. During Masses this weekend, Catechists and Religion Teachers will be commissioned in their ministry. Know, though, that these words extend to each one of us as we bring the light of Christ to the world. May our Christ lights burn brightly for all to see.
