Adopting an Updated Constitution

Our gratitude to Mark Fenske and the OSLC Council for all their work bringing our current constitution in line with the 2019 ELCA Model Constitution. While there a number of minor edits that were required, the most significant ones were:

Pastors now may be voting members of the council.

Council members can now serve 2 consecutive terms.

Congregation meetings can now be virtual.

All edits have been reviewed and approved by the OSLC Council in addition to an increase to the amount Council can approve for unbudgeted expenditure from \$2,000 -\$5,000.
