ADVENT 2022: PEOPLE, LOOK EAST!

Our theme this Advent comes from the title of a poem by British poet, author, and journalist Eleanor Farjeon (1881-1965). She is best known for writing the poem "Morning Has Broken," in 1931; forty years later, set to a traditional Gaelic tune, it became a musical hit for singer Cat Stevens. Her poem, "People, Look East!" is all about making preparations for the coming of the Christ Child. In the line, "make your house as you are able, trim the hearth and set the table," we are reminded of our own holiday preparations, but we can also sense a metaphor here: how do we prepare a home in our hearts for Christ to enter?
