Greetings SUMC Friends and Family,

Advent has arrived. I'm ready. This season SUMC is focusing on <u>Waiting</u> as we prepare for the arrival of our King. Many of us aren't very good at waiting. Have you seen the cartoon entitled "Drive through Christmas?" Underneath the golden arches, there's a big sign: "McChristmas." The caption: "One 'Christmas Joy Combo' — super-sized. Hold the Advent." In the ancient Church, Advent was a time of abstaining from public festivity in order to prepare for the holy day of Christmas. The twelve days of Christmas didn't begin till Christmas Day. As unpopular as it may be, the 12 Days of Christmas still begin on Christmas Day. Waiting is important. It gives us time to not only think about what is to come but to prepare for it. Still, waiting is difficult. One thing I have learned is that God is not in a hurry. In fact, in the waiting, God is at work in our lives forming and shaping us to fulfill His desire for us. Will you trust this is true?

These days preparing for the waiting, I have been thinking about our Music Minister, Megan. God sent Megan at the very time Sebastian needed her. And in these nearly 14 years God has formed and shaped her ministry and the ministry of SUMC. In the waiting for what is next for her and for us at SUMC, I know that Megan has touched me. In the twenty-one months that I have been here, Megan has reinforced no less than three areas of how best to Praise God in the church amidst the waiting:

First, planning ahead...way ahead. Waiting does not mean inaction on our part, waiting means becoming prepared for all that God has for us next. Second, Megan welcomes and actively waits. No matter how good (or not so good) you are in music, you are welcome to give what you've got. She never waits for us to be good enough to sing or play, she takes us as we are, encourages, challenges and lifts us up and in the molding and rehearsing, and she waits patiently as we learn. Finally, for Megan, worship is more than a passion or a duty; worship is a way of life, a heartbeat, a necessity in the work of the church. Worship is waiting on the Lord with the best we have.

This preacher's prayer is always that in the waiting, we would be transformed, changed, by the work of Jesus in this season. Megan has been with SUMC for fourteen Advents. The work that Christ has done in her has changed her, made her more. Moreover, whether here for fourteen years or twenty-one months, the work Christ has done in Megan has changed us. *Thank you Megan for your faithfulness to God and to the ministry of this congregation, you are a blessing*. May you be blessed as you embark on your next chapter of God's call on your life, planning, welcoming and worshipping with joy and with integrity. We can hardly wait! And for SUMC...you just wait. God has more for us too.

Just a note from Megan Mash



O come, O come, Emmanuel, and ransom captive Israel, that mourns in lonely exile here until the Son of God appear. Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to thee, O Israel.

For my final Beacon article, I want to leave you with a reprint of one of my favorite hymns. I want you all to know how much you have blessed me on my journey. I feel so fortunate to have made so many wonderful friends that I am now able to call family here at SUMC. Thank you for the opportunity to serve God in Sebastain, to take risks, and to grow together.

Advent is my favorite season. One way to help embrace Advent is to use an Advent hymn as part of your devotional time. "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel" is a very rich text that could be used. This hymn has an interesting history. The text comes from the O Antiphons which originated in the 8th century. An antiphon is a verse, usually from Scripture that is said or sung responsively. One antiphon was sung at Vespers prior to the *Magnificat*, the Song of Mary, each of the seven days leading up to Christmas. In the Middle Ages and Renaissance, the number of antiphons could be as many as twelve. Composers throughout history have used individual antiphons to create a single piece of music. The seven antiphons in order are; O Wisdom, O Sacred Lord, O Root of Jesse, O Key of David, O Dayspring, O King of all the Nations, and O Emmanuel. Notice that what is the final antiphon is most common to us as the first stanza of "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel." This order is important because when read from last to first in Latin, the first initial creates the acrostic *ero cras*, which means, "I will be present tomorrow." This reveals the promise of Christmas and the promise that Christ is the same yesterday, today, and tomorrow. Each antiphon has scripture that is associated with it (see chart below for scripture references). These passages are related both to Christ's birth as well as the second coming.

The tune for "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel" was originally thought to have been copied from a French Missal by John Mason Neale, a well-known hymn translator of the nineteenth century. Another theory about the tune suggested that Thomas Helmore had written the tune and presented it as being a French chant. However, in the 1960's the original chant was found in the Paris National Library. The tune originally had no association to Advent but was instead used as a funeral litany for saints. Carlton Young writes, "Perhaps it is a measure of Helmore's genius that he detected in this melody an appropriate Advent sound as well, one which conveys an unmistakable sense of solemn expectancy, not only for the Nativity of Christ, but also for his Second Coming as judge and as savior." The change of the music in the refrain highlights that the refrain is not part of the original text but added later. I invite you to use this hymn as part of your devotion the week before Christmas to help prepare your heart to receive anew the birth of the Christ Child.

Each Gospel, in its own way, leads us on the Advent journey of preparation for Christ's coming. Awaiting the Already, originally released in 2015, takes a tour through the four Gospel narratives that announce Christ's birth or make way for his ministry. Readers will discover what parts of the Christmas story come from which Gospel, recognizing an invitation from each Gospel writer to prepare for a fresh experience of Christ in the past and the future.

This five-session study includes four sessions for each week of Advent and one for Christmas. Each chapter provides questions for reflection or discussion, a brief prayer, and a focus for the upcoming week.
