A round table discussion with other churches and faiths to begin a food service ministry (like Soul Café). Beginning to plan Trunk or Treat. And, gathering to set a date for a SUMC Planning Event to calendar the years’ events for 2025 (See opportunities for ministries and mission leadership for 2025 in this edition of the Beacon)

But the doing, the adding and the planning are not the REAL JOY! The real joy is in the obedience and the desire to reach a community for Christ. If we are making a move that God does not see for us, I pray that we are strong and mature enough to make the changes that God desires. At SUMC, I pray that all we are planning and doing pleases God first. Isn’t that what we are all about? Not ministries, programs, things to do; no, not even people or finances - But God, our Savior first! To live pleasing Jesus so that we may...***in Him [be] built together into a dwelling place for God by the Spirit!*** Will you pray with me as we move upward toward our goal and inward to the power of the Holy Spirit as we are blessed and we are a blessing?

WHAT YOU CAN DO THIS SUMMER (*Pastor Alexis is happy to assist you in finding what you need*):

Read on...

- Read a “How To” study the Bible. Read something that will help you better understand what you are reading in the Bible.
- Spend time “side by side.” Take your Bible and another Bible translation and read the same passage side by side.
- Research the culture and/or historical setting of a group of people or a place in the Bible. *Example: The exiled Jews; Nineveh; the Philistines; Capernaum; Philippi; Corinth; Bethlehem.*
- Select which commentaries you want to use to supplement your Bible study.
- Read a book or letter of the Bible and use tools/texts to study more deeply.

Do something different...

- Read something completely different. For example, if your last study was inductive, read something devotional or topical.
- Invite a friend for coffee and ask each other questions about a scripture passage you have learned/ studied. This can be especially fun if your friend is studying something different.
- Listen to a new Bible Study or sermon podcast.
- Relax and revisit one of your favorite devotionals.

FLORIDA UNITED METHODIST CHILDREN'S HOME IS NOW RESIDING HOPE

Why the New Name?

The Florida United Methodist Children's Home was first established in 1908 as the Florida Methodist Orphanage. Since that time it has grown into a holistic organization serving abused, abandoned, and neglected children from across the state of Florida. In addition to providing a higher level of therapeutic residential care in two locations, we also provide foster care and outpatient counseling in multiple counties.

We realized that we had outgrown the Children's Home name, and needed something that better represented the purpose we serve and the care we provide. That new name is **Residing Hope**.

The word hope is commonly used to mean a wish or desire. But in the Bible, hope is the confident expectation of what God has promised and the strength of His faithfulness. Residing Hope expresses optimism and the opportunity of a better life of the children and youth we serve. It's that compassionate care that drives everything we do across all of our services and locations.

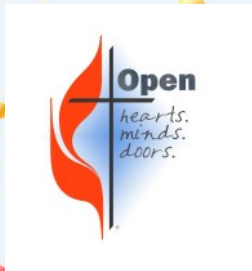
