Greetings Church Family and Friends,

As I sit and write, my mind easily shifts to some time away I will be taking this month. My journey begins on May 20th. I will pick up my mom in Jacksonville and we will travel to Gulf Shores, Alabama. It was a summer stomping ground for my mom's cousins (paternal). She never had an opportunity to join them and wants to see the place for herself. Now, I imagine that it's changed some since the '50's but she is sensitive and will appreciate imagining those days even as we make memories of our own. Embedded in that trip will be 3 days "unplugged" (23 – 25). I will almost be like a three day Sabbath. Time to reflect on my time at Sebastian; to think about how God desires for me to better myself; to sleep and rest; and to read…love to read! This gift of days will be rich as I spend it with the Lord and my mother.

Time away also gives perspective on ministry mine to God; mine to you at SUMC and mine to the Sebastian community. As I prepare for this reflection time, I am drawn to a writing I did a decade ago. I share it in the light of traveling away. I share it knowing that however much I desire to be directed by God in my life, I fall short even if I doing a great mission work...In February 2013 I wrote...I try so hard to be a good Christian...a really good follower of Christ. I want to do all the right things and say all the right things and live a life worthy of the title, "Christian." It is deep in me - to want to live as Christ desires me to live. But honestly, whether I am really, really good or not, I will never measure up to bethe kind of Christians that the Bible standards want me to be. Still, I must try even if I can't be for God what I should. And truth is even with Billy Graham or (Saint now – 2018) Mother Teresa qualities, how could I ever meet God's expectations? And then I heard a word from Bob Kemp (retired now), pastor at Gateway inTexas. This is what he said (are you ready for this...it changes everything)...we are not to work or do or be for God...but we are to work and do and be FROM God!

You see, we cannot ever do enough for God but think of all we can do, Sebastian, if we willingly receive FROM God and live out of His overflow. Verse 16 of James tells us, *Every good and perfect gift is from above coming down from the Father of Light*. That's how I want to live...and that is how I want our church to live!! Let's not try to please God, "getting on His good side" and hoping for "kudos" from Him on occasion when it seems we are doing it right. Instead, together, let us receive FROM God and give to others from Him...as He freely gives to us!

Even eleven years later, I find myself pondering my role here at SUMC and SUMC's role in the community. This summer after I return from Alabama and from Annual Conference (June 5-8), I want to role up my sleeves and put to work all that is coming to us FROM God! Watch your bulletin for opportunities to serve as a FIRST IMPRESSION to the community. Watch, too, for how you can help with Chum Buckets and at Wabasso UMC. Consider becoming a part of the Congregational Care Team (see Kathi White) as we continue to reach out in loving ways to those who are homebound. Or participating in Vacation Bible School (See Pastor Ginger or Betty Hays). Or how about Summer Small Group at a café or coffee shop near by (I love Riverview Books and Latte-da)...anyone interested? Let me know. My prayer is that as we gear up to be a blessing this summer to one another and to those in our community! And that together, we find that our source FROM God for all that is good! May we give thanks to God for each other!



Why the New Name?

The Florida United Methodist Children's Home was first established in 1908 as the Florida Methodist Orphanage. Since that time it has grown into a holistic organization serving abused, abandoned, and neglected children from across the state of Florida. In addition to providing a higher level of therapeutic residential care in two locations, we also provide foster care and outpatient counseling in multiple counties.

We realized that we had outgrown the Children's Home name, and needed something that better represented the purpose we serve and the care we provide. That new name is Residing Hope.

The word hope is commonly used to mean a wish or desire. But in the Bible, hope is the confident expectation of what God has promised and the strength of His faithfulness. Residing Hope expresses optimism and the opportunity of a better life of the children and youth we serve. It's that compassionate care that drives everything we do across all of our services and locations.

AN EXCERPT RESPONSE to the 2024 GENERAL CONFERENCE by Rev. John Gill to his congregation: Tomoka UMC:

Friends, as you may know, the General Conference of our United Methodist Church has just completed their two-week session, and by all accounts, it was an amazing and joyous gathering! The Holy Spirit moved throughout the process, and a new sense of unity and purpose emerged. After fifty years of bickering which has led to an exodus of the more fundamentalist congregations, we have finally turned a corner toward a more harmonious and joyful future.

During all those years of division, pastors have stood behind the table for Holy Communion and declared that ours is an "open table" where all are welcome as part of the Family of God. This is one of the reasons we all love the United Methodist Church — that we extend the love and grace to ALL, no matter what. Unfortunately, while our rhetoric was noble and correct, the reality in the Book of Discipline and in the practice of ministry in many congregations (including to some extent here at Tomoka) said otherwise. While we claimed to be a church where all are created in the image of God, we have by our prejudices and actions, denied equal status to ALL.

This has been a sin on behalf of our denomination, and the source of an un-godly divisive spirit in our churches. It has led us to a schism, dividing God's people into two camps and now two denominations — a result that certainly grieves Christ, whose most ardent prayer is that all his followers might be one, just as He and the Father are one. Sadly, this brokenness cannot be undone.

Now it is time to turn the page, to repent of our sins of prejudice against a whole class of our sisters and brothers, to ask for forgiveness for how we have failed to live-out Christ's command to love one another, above all else. I ask you to join me in repenting the harm we have done to our sisters and brothers who may love differently than most of us.

That is why these past two weeks have been such a blessing! By the actions our General Conference has taken to right the wrongs of the past fifty years, the UMC is poised to embark on a fresh new future where all are valued, all are loved, and all are included — not only at the Table of Christ, but as fully equal members within the Body of Christ.

Therefore, this is a day of celebration. A day of resurrection. God is doing a new thing among us – if we will let Him

Hospitality: Let's add to the great ministry we already do: *Fellowship Café, Potluck, Sunday Greeters. Potentially, we could add: a Welcome Center table for guests; a follow-up of guests ministry; annual campus curb-appeal inventory.*

Altar/Sanctuary Guild: Cleaning the brass plates and candles; assist Cathy with straightening the pews after worship; sitting on the Worship Team (meets every 6 weeks).

Children's Ministry: Join the team to plan three events annually; teach the Child/Youth Protection Policy; Plan Sunday School; Create a strategy to reach children and their families; and more!

Anti-Racism: Two - Four representatives to work with the district and the conference in dealing
