

In order to understand and appreciate Paul's life and to more deeply understand how he took Christianity to the nations; we will spend the month of May through June 21st traveling with him on his journeys, stopping along the way at the congregations he established.



Some good news about Soul Café but also a challenge for the months ahead

In March of 2020 we all took on the mission of the Soul Café. We partnered with the Salvation Army and with Roseland United Methodist. We have consistently

fed an average of over 100 folks, weekly. That equates to over 10,000 meals. That is quite an undertaking for a church of our size. That work was done by less than 40 members and friends of SUMC; along with the Salvation Army supplying the food. Most of the folks we feed are seniors, living in our two senior low-income housing complexes plus a few neighboring folks that need and look forward to our Monday lunches.

In addition to the food items that we get from The Salvation Army, we get all produce needed from our local produce stand on HWY 1. Kroegels Produce as joined with us to allow for these folks to get healthier meals. Carey & her husband, Tim contacted me over a year ago and asked if they could help by donating all produce, we need for our lunches. Every week, I determine what produce is needed, send the list to Carey and then pick up produce on Saturday or Sunday afternoon. What a blessing Kroegels has been to this mission and to our community.

So now we come to a dilemma. I need your help to figure out what to do going forward.

The Salvation Army is going through a change in May and June. Their Captains are being moved to Tennessee in June (they function much the same as the UM do regarding moving pastors) In addition to that they have just had 2 resignations form the people we depend on to get our food. 1 who places our order and the other who delivers the food to us.

They would still be able to place our orders but they have no one who is willing or able to deliver it weekly from their location in south Vero. I have been told by Captain Amber that once they are able to hire a new person they could once again deliver food to us.

So what should we do???

We can temporarily stop doing the meals with May 9^{th} being our last meal until The Salvation Army can continue to bring the food to us. Or, we can go to Vero to pick up the food & bring it here.

I will be sending an email to all Soul Café volunteers to see if any of them or someone they may know would take on this function. Likewise, I am asking all who read this to consider getting the food each week or letting me know if you know of someone who would want to take this on.

I pray that there can be a good outcome to this problem, please pray with me. Blessings Donna Oborne, Mission Chair

Just a note from Megan Mash

Will you come and follow me if I but call your name?
Will you go where you don't know and never be the same?
Will you let my love be shown, will you let my name be known, will you let my life be grown in you and you in me?

"The Summons" is one of my favorite hymns. It was written by John Bell who is a member of the Iona Community. This intentional community was founded on the remote island of Iona in western Scotland. Its roots date back to the 6th century when St. Columba used the island as a base to evangelize to all of Scotland. The Iona Community was established in the 1930's by George MacLeod (1895-1991) to train ministers to engage with poor working-class people. They also rebuilt the abandoned Benedictine Abbey. John Bell was given membership into the Iona Community in 1980. Bell has become a world-renowned leader of worship and congregational song. "The Summons" first appeared in the first musical collection produced by the Wild Goose Worship Group, Heaven Shall Not Wait: Songs of Creation, the Incarnation, and the Life of Jesus (1987).

Like "Here I Am Lord," the voice changes in the text. The first four stanzas we hear God speaking to us through a series of thirteen questions. In the first set of questions God asks not simply if we will follow but if we are willing to go to the hard, unknown places so that God's love may be known. The next questions start off by asking if we will put aside ourselves and "care for cruel and kind." The next question asks "Will you risk the hostile stare would your life attract or scare?" This again emphasizes that in order to follow Christ we must move beyond ourselves and place our trust in God as we are led to serve in situations that scare us. We are called to "set the prisoner free" and "kiss the leper clean." God calls us to serve and love the lost and the least. No one is unlovable in God's eyes. When you "use the faith you've found to reshape the world around" you find the courage to move beyond your fear to the places God calls. Each question always asks if we will respond if God only calls our name. This means the call will not always be clear or specific. Like Samuel, sometimes we only hear God call our name and must wait to find out the details of the call. Each question also asks if we will do these things and never be the same. As we live out God's call in our life, we are changed. The more we allow God to change us, the more we are enabled to live out God's plan for our life.

The final stanza changes to our voice and answers the previous questions.

Lord, your summons echoes true when you but call my name. Let me turn and follow you and never be the same. In your company I'll go where your love and footsteps show. Thus I'll move and live and grow in you and you in me.

CHUM BUCKETS - Sebastian River High School. Deliver food to the FOOD INSECURE

On a Thursday in April, Ed from Chum Buckets, who coordinates the drivers, told Pastor Alexis that one of the regular delivery people is moving away leaving 15 boxes needing delivery. These particular boxes are for the Fellsmere area. One person with a vehicle will need about 2 hours from load to delivery. (Two vehicles would make more sense - even three - to shorten the time needed.) Delivery pick – ups are:

- Thursday anytime between 8 am 10:30 am across from the R.O.T.C. building.
- The boxes are 8 10 lbs. each.
- Most homes do not have stairs.

SUMC folk, if you have time and energy, this ministry area is gratifying. Commit to a week or a month and see how it works for you. For more information, leave a message at the Church Office and Ann or Pastor will contact you with more details.

Joanne Holmes's daughter was an English teacher; besides grading papers, planning and prepping for the classroom, she noticed her daughter would also pack snacks. She finally asked her why she packed so many. Michele told her mom, she packed them for students to satisfy their hunger so they could concentrate better on learning. This encouraged Joanne to not only help her daughter but to also help the students at the school.

In September of 2015, Joann Holmes and Carol Scaramuzzi saw a need for a need pantry. Carol and Joanne approached Mr. Racine, the principal at Sebastian River High School (SRHS) with their idea to help families going through some rough times so students would not go hungry. He had just 3 "rules" that he felt needed to be met.

They were:

- •The pantry had to be for SRHS Students.
- •Food had to be delivered and picked up by volunteers- not students.
- •No students were to be in the pantry during academic hours.

Joanne and Carol agreed. Michele's English class students came up with the name: "Chum Bucket" which aligns with the school's mascot which is a shark. The Chum Bucket helps approximately 60 families and their names are kept confidential.

Follow – up on April District Training written by Lois Planeta and Pastor Alexis

Thanks to Bill Messersmith, Lay Leader; Bill Oborne, Council Chairperson, Ben Aston and Lois Planeta, Small Group Leaders; Alan Shepper, Finance Chairperson, Linda Grabis, Choir member and Pastor Alexis for attending the Thrive District Leadership Day.

It was great fun! Praise band did its job. The place was rockin'! Then came Pastor Matt Hartsfield. Wow! Energy! Energy! Right away we had to stand and use our Confidence

Posture! We know it – Shoulders back; hands on hips, suck in tummy and stand tall. We're standing tall and confident in Christ. Tall and joyful! Project energy and let Christ work through us!

The day was filled with music and prayer; a greeting from our District Superintendent, Pastor Dionne Hammond; Pastor Matt Hartsfield, our Keynote Speaker and several "Break Out" groups of specialty ministries. Our challenge as congregations, as we survived the pandemic, is to look at what it means to THRIVE post-pandemic. Below is are notes about Pastor Matt's example of what is called a Confidence Quotient (CQ) and Creating a Culture of Innovation.

A large part of Pastor Matt's first message focused on the exchange when God called Moses to bring His people out of Egypt. Moses was having none of it! Five times Moses dug in his heels and five times God responded. Here is the exchange summary from Exodus:

Exodus 3:9 Go – I am sending you to Pharaoh 9

Moses' five "No's" to God and God's five responses (are we much different?)

Moses: who am I (Ex 3:11) GOD: It's not about you Moses: I have no credibility GOD: I have credibility - I AM

Moses: I don't have what it takes (4:1)

Moses: I'm not enough

Moses: I'm the wrong person

GOD: I'll use what you already have

GOD: I'm enough – I will instruct you

GOD: I'll surround you w/ the right people

Just like Moses, we need to let the Lord work through us. Let God use us. Leave our impossible to Him. Don't miss God's call. Pastor Matt challenged us and assured us God will help us meet the challenges.

Pastor Matt's second talk was about *Creating an Innovative Church Spirit* using Jesus' mother, Mary as an example (Luke 1). Pastor Matt began by reminding us that BIRTH IS MESSY...and that birthing means new is here.

When the Angel speaks to Mary, she is perplexed - Completely unprepared/ill equipped. Sometimes we disqualify ourselves from **Innovative Ministry**. In ministry think of all the phrases you use to disqualify yourself. The real question is: Do we believe that we can get people connected to Jesus? Or do we say that there is no way?

Look at the Difference between:

Luke 1: 34 "How will this be," Mary asked the angel, "since I am a virgin?" and

Luke 1:38 I am the Lord's servant," Mary answered. "May your word to me be fulfilled

Verse 34: In the life of my church how much do I hear that it can't happen; verse 38: Let's build the kingdom of God together. The distinction between these verses is simply: The power of the Holy Spirit will do this. We are "highly favored" just as Mary. It's not what we can do! But what God can do in us! Will you join God! "The power of the Holy Spirit will overshadow you." Verse 37: For nothing is impossible with God!



Pastor Matt concluded this challenge: You do the possible – leave the impossible up to God. (Don't disqualify yourself!!!).

Hey Sebastian Church, take the *Confidence Quotient Survey*. In which of these does SUMC lack confidence. In which of these does SUMC show great confidence:

Dwelling on past setbacks and failures

Negative People surrounding you – neg. in the church (We are the product of 5 people we spend the most time with)

Negative self-talk (self-limiting/limiting ministries because we don't believe we can...)

Comparison game (Look how much "more" that church has)

Minimizing what you do have (we just can't do that because we don't have)

Maximizing (magnify – if only we had...)

Perfectionism (this is different than excellence)

Body Language – effects the way we share/show confidence

Doubting God. Identity you have in God. Do you believe God or not

Lack of gratitude – (missing the "GOOD" that God is doing around us)

Pastor Alexis volunteered to deliver boxes on Thursday mornings. She has been delivering every Thursday--she has asked for volunteers to help--maybe take turns--if interested please call her.

Mary's Circle is going to be volunteering to pack the boxes on Wednesday mornings. We will do twice a month - every SECOND and FOURTH Wednesdays.

This is a year -round program, so Mary's Circle has committed to do this all year. We will also be collecting food—and more information about this to follow.

Pastor Alexis hosted us on April 8th at the parsonage. After our meeting, she served a delicious lunch. We played games about the women of the UMW and women of the church in general. We learned a lot of history had a few laughs-and thoroughly enjoyed our time together.

On April 13th we took a trip to HIBISCUS CHILDREN'S VILLAGE. This was an extensive tour, which included one of the homes the children live in. We watched a video which was very heart warming. Mary's Circle will continue to support Hibiscus Children's Center as one of our mission projects and are looking forward to another visit in the fall.

April was our last general meeting until September 16th. Our annual Spring Luncheon is Friday May 13th (11a.m.) at Sebastian Saltwater Restaurant (formally Captain Bucher's)
