Blest Be the Tie That Binds: Part 1

One of the less derogatory descriptions of Methodism is that we sing our faith, and that is very true. Charles Wesley, younger brother to John Wesley, wrote over 5,000 hymns, and a few of them are in our hymnal (ex: "Love Divine, All Loves Excelling", "Hark the Herald Angels Sing", "O for a Thousand Tongues to Sing"). Even though it was not written by Charles Wesley, there is a hymn that I hope will be an inspiration to you as we face difficult times as a congregation. It was written by John Fawcett in 1782, and the title is "Blest Be the Tie That Binds." This week I'll focus on the first verse.

Blest be the tie that binds / Our hearts in Christian love /

The "tie" that the stanza mentions is Christ our Lord. He is what binds us together as a congregation. While our intellect is certainly a part of our spirituality, it is our hearts that are tied to our risen Lord and Savior. In that relationship, and as a part of the KINdom of God, we then feel God's unconditional love for us—that we are adopted as his children just as we are, and as imperfect as we are. The unconditional nature of *agape* love is vitally important to understand. Just as God loves us with all <u>our</u> faults and shortcomings, so too are we to love others with <u>their</u> faults and shortcomings. This thought is also expressed in the Lord's Prayer: *Forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us.*" If that other person, with different perspectives and approaches, is tied to Christ, then we are tied to them as well. That is what Jesus asks of us; to do what is difficult in our interactions with others, not what is easy. If we are willing, there is a sweet sense of spiritual freedom, healing, and power when we can love others without putting conditions on them.

The fellowship of kindred minds / Is like to that above.

Our ability to reason—the other side of our personal spirituality—is very much in play in our effort to be bound together in Christ Jesus our Lord. We do not lose the ability to think; we are, in fact, encouraged to use it to overcome social conventions that are contrary to the teaching of Jesus (greed, pride, prejudice, etc.). The sweet sense of freedom, healing, and power to overcome the evil around us creates fellowship. It doesn't matter whether the gathering is a worship service, Sunday school, a dinner, a mission project, a meeting, a clean up day, or some other small group, we feel a sense of closeness to each other that allows for differences of opinion in our joint faith in Christ. Fellowship is a horizontal and human representation that mirrors the vertical relationship of divine grace we have with God, and that God has with us. Together, we can indeed do all things in Christ who strengthens us.


