UNITED

I will describe to you how I have become one of the guardians of the term "UNITED" for many years. The story must go way back to our membership in the Evangelical United Brethren Church of the Cross in Salina. We were searching for a new church after we were transferred to Salina, and the Church of the Cross was just completing a new building. My skimpy church background was Evangelical and Reformed and my wife had been a Mennonite.

She was strong on believers immersion for Baptism. So our children had not been baptized. The pastor at the Church of the Cross was <u>dedicating</u> children on the first Sunday we attended. We were curious, and the pastor came that afternoon to describe the belief that children could be dedicated to God, and later baptized when they chose. That was a fit for us.

We probably learned about the union between the United Brethren and the Evangelical Church, (Wesleyan theology and German language) and why leaving UNITED in the name was very important. But our main interest was in our small Bible study group that met weekly and our Sunday school class. But that fine group and the study lead me to want to work in the church full time. But when the time came for me to have a student appointment, the EUB church did not have an opening. So I turned to the Methodist Church for a student appointment while I studied at Kansas Wesleyan.

The year after I entered seminary, the EUB church and the Methodist church merged. The 1968 merger created the UNITED Methodist Church. For we that were former EUB, the word UNITED was very important. Many clergy and lay persons in the much larger Methodist Church were often lazy and skipped the UNITED in the name of the church. So a few of us assisted them to become more careful and use the proper name.

When I finished seminary, I was serving a United Methodist Church in Leavenworth, so during the time of appointments I received a phone call, and the Wichita District Superintendent said that they had an appointment for me in Wichita. Our response as a family was that we did not choose to have our girl that was entering high school, and our son in Middle school go to school in Wichita. Could you find another place for us? About three hours later the phone rang. This time it was Bishop Stowe. "Garry, I need you to serve a church in Wichita, will you do it"? I could push back at a District Superintendent, but nobody pushed back at Bishop Stowe. Why did he NEED us in Wichita?

COME, LET'S JOURNEY TOGETHER LIVING LIFE, LOVING JESUS Before the Evangelical and the United Brethren denominations combined Bethel United Methodist Church had been the flagship church of the Evangelical denomination, and West Side United Methodist Church had been the flagship of the United Brethren denomination in Kansas. The pastor at Bethel had died, and the Bishop wanted someone with EUB history to become their pastor. So we came to Wichita, and only learned this connection later.

Six years later at appointment time I was the Secretary of the Annual Conference, and the Cabinet wanted me to be fairly close to the Conference Office, but policy was that you did not get to stay in Wichita. "Garry, go out and look over Towanda and Benton," the District Superintendent said. Itinerant preachers go where they are sent. Again there was a follow-up phone call. "Garry, we want you to go to West Side United Methodist Church in Wichita." Once again my EUB history determined where I was appointed because West Side was the former flagship of the United Brethren church and they want someone with my history. I continue today, fifty four years after that UNITED Methodist Church union, I remind people that UNITED is an important part of our name.

Now things have evolved again so the UNITED becomes an important part of our name at a new higher level. A very small percentage of congregations have chosen to leave the denomination. What will they name themselves? The early indications are that there will be a fairly wide variety of directions taken. A denomination <u>may</u> be formed that decides to continue to use the word Methodist. Some of the churches will become non-affiliated with any other church group. Some have ceased to be a church. But for the vast majority of us that are the moderate, loving followers of Jesus, the use of UNITED in our name has become important to identify the vast majority that remain UNITED METHODISTS.

Jesus Children Our Talents

We all have special items that we put in a place where they will not be broken and maybe not even seen by others. By putting them in this "safe" place we do not use them. We keep them buried in a closet or setting on a top shelf. We do not enjoy these items and do not share them with others.

You know, Jesus told a story about something similar. Bible, Jesus talked about someone who gave money to three of his servants, before going on a trip. The man gave different amounts to each persons, and he wanted them to use the money wisely and make more money. Well, two of the men did what they were supposed to by using the money to make more. another servant, who had smallest amount of money, refused to use it or spend it. He was so worried that he buried his money! When the master came back, he was pleased with the servants who used their talents and earned more...but he was angry with the one who hid his away. He said at least the man could have put the money in the bank to save with interest. He didn't do what was intended with the gift he was given.

Remember that God gives us special blessings, and wants us to use them well. Some people are talented in school or work, and others are really good at sports or Maybe you have a talent for talking or making friends. doesn't want us to hide or hold onto what we have, but to use it to bless other people. If we have material things like money or toys we can share those with people we We can honor God by using our talents to love and serve Him and one another. When we give things away, great and remarkable things happen. Why don't we thank God for His blessings, and ask Him to help us use them for others?
