- 1. When someone is within the church building alone, they should LOCK all exterior doors. The Trustees are checking on a doorbell that could be installed to let someone know that another person is present.
- 2. Research is being done to allow the front doors to have emergency bars installed so that even if the door is locked someone can get <u>out</u> through them.
- 3. Emergency hardware is already installed on the exit doors at the end of the hall by the resource room, and by exit in the kitchen.
- 4. Research is being done on the purchase of a defibrillator for the church.


