With Love in Your Heart

“A new command I give you; Love one another, as I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another.” John 13:34,35

Soon summer time will give way to school starting. Let’s use our summertime to remember a good lesson. Summertime is a great time for fresh fruit. A juicy peach is so good this time of year. Good Words from Chaplain Mike

As this month marks the beginning of the school year, it's good to consider what the Bible book of Proverbs says about wisdom. The book begins with these words, "The proverbs of Solomon the son of David, king of Israel: To know wisdom and instruction, to perceive the words of understanding, To receive the instruction of wisdom, Justice, judgment and equity; To give prudence to the simple, To the young man knowledge and discretion—A wise man will hear and increase learning, And a man of understanding will attain wise counsel....." (Proverbs 1: 1-5, NKJV)

The meaning of wisdom in the Bible, the Word of God, is living righteously before God—living according to His instructions and commands. Chapter 1, verse 7 says, "The fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge, but fools despise wisdom and instruction."
