DID YOU KNOW? What is Tithing? Tithing recognizes that God has graciously bestowed blessings upon us, and we in return offer a thanksgiving sacrifice of one-tenth of the "first fruits." The word tithe comes from the Angelo-Sacon word teotha meaning "a tenth." The first mention of a tithe in the Bible occurs in Genesis when Melchizedek, a king and a "priest of God Most High," offered a sacrifice of bread and wine in thanksgiving for Abraham's victory over several enemy kings. As a offering to God, Abraham gave Melchizedek "a tenth of everything." Genesis 14. The key to understanding how God wants us to give to the Church is found in 1 Corinthians 16:2, "On the first day of the week [Sunday] each of you should set aside whatever he can afford."

Diocesan Notices

NEW JERSEY INDEPENDENT VICTIMS COMPENSATION PROGRAM The Diocese of Camden – along with the other Roman Catholic dioceses in New Jersey – has established an Independent Victim Compensation Program (IVCP) to compensate those who, as children or young adults, were sexually abused by a priest of the Diocese.

The IVCP is independently administered by experienced victim compensation experts Kenneth R. Feinberg and Camille S. Biros.

The IVCP will handle the submission, evaluation and resolution of individual claims, and operates independently of the Diocese or any church-affiliated institution. The administrators of the IVCP have complete autonomy to determine the eligibility of a claim with the guidelines of the established Protocol. The amount of compensation for those who make a claim will be independently determined by the IVCP administrators. All victims – no matter when the abuse occurred – are eligible to participate, and all matters will be handled confidentially.

Victims of clergy sexual abuse of a minor can begin the process of utilizing the program by going to www.njdiocesesivcp.com and reviewing the protocol for submitting a claim.

Bishop Sullivan strongly encourages anyone who was sexually victimized by a priest of the Diocese to participate in the IVCP, and has asked that anyone who knows of someone who was abused to contact them so that they are aware of the IVCP and can participate in it.

CATHOLIC NEWS SERVICE ISSUE ALERT **THE SEAL OF THE CONFESSIONAL**

In several states and around the world, there is a growing legislative effort to force Catholic priests to divulge anything they hear in the confessional regarding the abuse of children

or vulnerable adults. The church has long defended the seal of the confessional as inviolable, and priests have been martyred for refusing to divulge a penitent's sins.

Unfortunately, many Americans today, including Catholics, do not understand why the Catholic Church defends the inviolability of the seal. Religious Education

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Begins as children enter the First Grade and continues through Confirmation. The policy of the Diocese is that a child must be in continuous Religious Education to be considered a candidate for Confirmation. Diocesan Policy also states children receive their Sacraments in the Parish in which their Family is registered. If your child / children attend catholic school please contact the Religious Education Office with your child / children's school information.

REGISTRATION FOR 2019-2020

All students need to register for classes each year.

If your family has a returning student please complete a re-registration Form. If you are registering a child for the 1st time please fill out a New Student Registration Form. All Registration Forms are now available on our website at www.holyeucharistcherryhill.org Under the Religious Education Tab. Place all paperwork and tuition in an envelope and mark Religious Education Office. All registration Forms may be mailed, dropped in the collection basket at Mass OR put in the black mailbox outside of the Parish Center double glass doors.
