On February 3, 1943 aboard U.S.A.T. Dorchester were Four Chaplains.

US Army Lt. Clark V. Poling (Reformed Church of America, Alexander D. Goode(Jewish), Joseph P. Washington (Catholic) and George L. Fox (Methodist)

They helped save over 200 soldiers. At the end of their lives, putting aside their differences, they gave up their own lives by giving up their individual life jackets to spare the life of someone else. Before the Dorchester went down, they were seen with their arms linked together praying. I assume it would've been for the safety of their fellow men.

During this time of COVID-19, political unrest, Black Lives Matter, homelessness, mental health, economical discourse, etc. whatever we are experiencing as an individual, State, Nation and World, in The Spirit of The Four Chaplains, everyone's life matters.

In order to be united, we need to put aside our differences so others may survive.
