



MADAME OPHELIA DEVORE: The "First Lady" of Etiquette

In honoring Black History month, I am sure you can name a lot of people you are familiar with and talk about. However, this time, I want to share with you someone you may not have heard of. Madame Ophelia DeVore. I call her the "First Lady" of etiquette. Madame Ophelia DeVore is a legend in the field of Etiquette. She has helped to shape the image of countless actors, politicians and athletes while opening doors for African American models worldwide.

Madame DeVore was born August 12, 1921 in Edgefield, South Carolina. One of ten children, Madame DeVore was born to two mixed-race parents, John Walter DeVore and Mary Emma Strother.

In later years Madame DeVore became a prolific business woman by watching her father who was the owner of a traveling contracting company and her mother who was an etiquette instructor and musician.

Because her father's business demanded him to travel a great deal as a result when she was 11 years old, she went to live with her great aunt, Stella Carter in New York. She attended and graduated from the prestigious Hunter College High School in Manhattan.

While in high school, fiends urged Madame DeVore to model and she began landing modeling jobs in Europe. Because of her fair skin, she was able to book modeling jobs darker-skinned models were not able to secure during that time. However, Madame DeVore did a lot in her lifetime to change discrimination in the industry.

Madame DeVore went on to receive her bachelor's degree in mathematics, with a minor in several languages including French, Latin and German at New York University. In 1941 she continued her studies to include fashion, public relations and marketing. Later she married Vernon Mitchell.

After graduating from college and excelling in the fashion industry, Madame DeVore continued to feel the need to address the lack of opportunities in the fashion industry for women of color. As a result, she and friends came up with the idea to open a modeling agency that specialized in showcasing Black beauty. To better prepare herself, she attended Vogue's School of Modeling in New York. Upon completing her studies, she became a feature model for Ebony magazine the leading black magazine at that time.

In 1946, Madame DeVore opened the first black-owned modeling agency in New York, the Grace Del Marco Agency. Two years after opening the modeling agency, she opened the Ophelia DeVore School of Self-Development and Modeling where she trained over 20,000 students on everything from etiquette

to speech and ballet. Some of her class titles included Wardrobe I, II, and III, Figure Control with Fencing and Ballet; and Social Graces. Some of her students included, Diahann Carol, Beverly Johnson and the legendary Cicely Tyson.

Madame DeVore and her students achieved one of the highest honors in 1959 and 1960 when they became the first American of any race to win a title at the Cannes Film Festival. In 2006 she closed the doors to both her modeling agencies. She used those doors of opportunity



that had been open for her through modeling and etiquette to empower her community.

On February 28, 2014 Madame Ophelia DeVore passed away in Manhattan, New York. She was 92. She was a true pioneer of etiquette in the Black culture.



MANGO PEACH SMOOTHIE





It comes from the heart, so give it a try.


Love can even make people cry.
