

Old Testament Lesson:

New Testament Luke: 2:41-52 (NIV)

⁴¹ Every year Jesus' parents went to Jerusalem for the Festival of the Passover. ⁴² When he was twelve years old, they went up to the festival, according to the custom. ⁴³ After the festival was over, while his parents were returning home, the boy Jesus stayed behind in Jerusalem, but they were unaware of it. 44 Thinking he was in their company, they traveled on for a day. Then they began looking for him among their relatives and friends. 45 When they did not find him, they went back to Jerusalem to look for him. 46 After three days they found him in the temple courts, sitting among the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions. ⁴⁷ Everyone who heard him was amazed at his understanding and his answers. ⁴⁸ When his parents saw him, they were astonished. His mother said to him, "Son, why have you treated us like this? Your father and I have been anxiously searching for you." ⁴⁹ "Why were you searching for me?" he asked. "Didn't you know I had to be in my Father's

house?" But they did not understand what he was saying to them.

⁵¹ Then he went down to Nazareth with them and was obedient to them. But his mother treasured all these things in her heart. 52 And Jesus grew in wisdom and stature, and in favor with God and man.



Celebrating Black History Month

Today, for Black History Month, we celebrate one of our musical giants, **Rev. Dr. CHARLES ALBERT TINDLEY**, who was born in Maryland in 1851 and died July 1933. He was an African American Methodist minister and a gospel music composer. He was born the son of slave

parents, Charles and Esther Tindley. Rev. Tindley experienced a hard life for his mother died when he was four years old, and the following year he was separated from his father. Never able to go to school, Tindley had a burning desire to learn to read and write; therefore, he learned on his own by asking people to tutor him. He mastered reading and writing when he was seventeen. Shortly after the Civil War, he moved to Philadelphia with his wife Daisy, and worked as a brick carrier, a janitor at a small church, and attended night school. He even took a correspondence course from the Boston School of Theology, where he learned Hebrew and Greek.

Often referred to as "The Prince of Preachers," Tindley founded one of the largest Methodist congregations serving the African-American community on the East Coast of the United States. Without any degree, he was ordained to the Methodist Episcopal Church by examination, with high-ranking scores. He was also ordained as a Deacon in the Delaware Conference in 1887 and as an elder in 1889. He was assigned by his bishop to serve as an itinerant pastor staying a relatively short time at each charge in New Jersey, Delaware and then in Maryland in 1891.

Amazingly, in 1902, he became pastor of the Bainbridge Street Methodist Church of Philadelphia, the same church where he had once been a janitor. So successful was his leadership that, in 1907, a new building was needed for the growing congregation, a new building renamed the Tindley Temple Methodist Church. Here he preached to great throngs of people. Both blacks and whites were represented in the leadership of the church, along with Italians, Jews, Germans, Norwegians, Mexicans, and Danes. Eventually, he was presented the Doctor of Divinity Degree by Bennett College and Morgan College in Baltimore, MD.

Tindley was also a noted songwriter and composer of gospel hymns and is recognized as one of the founding fathers of American gospel music. Five of his hymns appear in the 1989 *United Methodist Hymnal*. He wrote both words and music for many gospel songs, among the most popular of which are "Beams of Heaven," "Nothing Between," "Leave It There," "I Have Found at Last a Savior," "Stand by Me," and "We'll Understand it Better By and By." It was Tindley's song "I'll Overcome Some Day," written in 1901, that served as a basis for "We Shall Overcome," a theme song of the civil rights movement.

We appreciate Rev. Charles Albert Tindley and thank him for all his accomplishments, which have been an inspiration for so many of us.
