There is a story about W.C. Fields, the famous vaudeville comedian, who was a notorious atheist. One evening before a performance, an assistant came into Field's dressing room and caught Fields reading the Bible. Embarrassed, Fields slammed the Bible shut and said, "Just looking for loopholes!"

Many years ago, Billy Graham held a rally in Central Park of New York, and on the day of the rally, a full-page ad appeared in the New York Times with these large letters:

LIFE.
YOU'RE BORN.
YOU SUFFER.
YOU DIE.

(But there's a loophole!)

The loophole is Jesus Christ.
The Easter story tells of this ultimate loophole.

I invite you to worship often during the Three Days and experience the never-ending faithfulness of God as revealed by Christ Jesus. On Maundy Thursday (April 1) hear of Jesus' dramatic signs in his commandment to love one another enacted in the washing of the disciples feet and in the meal of bread and wine, given and shed for you. On Good Friday (April 2) hear of the hidden-ness of God's glory in the rejection, pain, and humiliation Jesus suffered on the cross. And on Easter morning (April 4) hear of an empty tomb that reveals God's victory over death.

Yes, the crucified and risen Christ is the story of the God's ultimate loophole for us - God's love overcomes our brokenness. A "rerun" heard year after year that never gets old. May you experience this love and grow in faith during these Three Days. Tune in (or come safely), be nourished, go and serve others.

#### **In Person Worship Returns**

At the Feb. 16 Council Meeting, Pastor Bob gave an overview of the Covid Risk Level for Berks Country as found at this website: <a href="www.covidactnow.org/us/pennsylvania-pa/county/berks county/?s=1592532">www.covidactnow.org/us/pennsylvania-pa/county/berks county/?s=1592532</a>. Berks County was shown to be in the High Rick category. The specific indicators that are used to determine that risk are trending lower and they are lower than what they were when in –person worship was suspended on Nov. 12, The CDC recommendations at this time include that gathers should be limited to a maximum of 25 people with a physical distance maintained and mask are mandated for all indoor activities and should be worn whenever outside of the home. When taking into account that worshipers followed the safe practice guidelines well while in-person worship was offered in the July to November period and that the attendance exceeded 25 only one time, the congregation council decided to offer in-person worship on Sundays at 9:00 AM beginning on March 7. The same safety guidelines used for the July-November period will be in effect. These worship services will continued to be streamed online. Monthly Parking Lot Services with Holy Communion will also continue to be offered. Please do not interpret this action to mean that it is safe for everyone to come to in-person worship. Individuals are encouraged to make that decision based on their own health conditions, recommendations from their Primary Care Physicians, and a concern for others who are gathering to worship.

#### **Home Visitations**

Pastor Bob on February 19 received his second dose of the Moderna Covid-19 Vaccine. He is now willing to make home visits including the offering of Holy Communion. He will be making only one visit per day, limiting the length of the visit to 30 minutes, using proper hygiene and physical distancing and wearing a face mask. #### COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS - January/February 2021

- Council elected these members to serve as officers in 2021: President Jane Coombs;
   Vice-President Dustin Jacobs; Treasurer- Ron O'Brien; Secretary Rita Henning
- Council has advised Synod that we are ready to begin the Call Process. Congregation members who are thought to have the gifts to serve on the Call Committee were suggested by council members. Thirty-eight people were suggested for the seven

openings. The process to contact people to see if they are willing to serve will begin shortly.

- Worship in the sanctuary will begin on Sunday, March 7. All necessary safety procedures
  will be followed. Online streaming of the worship service will continue. Parking Lot
  Communion will continue to be held on the third Sunday of the month.
- A Digital Engagement Team has been formed to address how best to communicate with those who do not have internet access.
- Vernon Bright has retired from the Heidelberg Cemetery Board. We need a new person for this position which requires quarterly meetings. If you can serve, please contact any member of council, the church office or Pastor Bob.
- The Medical Clinic is offering telephone visits only at this time.
- Council affirmed that any congregation member is welcome to speak at a council meeting to share concerns or thanksgivings. Participants are to contact President Jane Coombs at 484-794-8441 to be placed on the agenda. Speaking time will be allotted at the beginning of the meeting and will be limited to 5 minutes per speaker.
