

1. The cemetery is divided into large 40' x 40' blocks with an aisle approximately 5-6 feet wide between each block. The location of the blocks are shown on plastic cards on the east and west fences. They are placed on the fence about midway through the block. Each block contains 32 grave sites. Each full block contains four (4) sections.
2. Some block numbers are not on the fence since they may be in an undeveloped area or outside the fence. Block numbers fewer than 38 will be on the west fence and every number over 39 will be on the east fence.
3. Each full block contains four (4) sections (sect.) 20' x 20'. Each section contains eight (8) grave sites.
4. Each grave site is five (5) feet wide and ten (10) feet long. The long way runs from east to west.
5. All layouts are in a basic clock like formation, whether square or oblong.
6. The blocks start in the southwest corner and goes north along the fence until it reaches the north fence. After reaching the north fence, we move east approximately 45' and start counting the blocks back south (toward the gate). This makes one circle of the so called clock dial.
7. We make two circles of blocks on the west side of the cemetery then we have a road, then three more circles of blocks on the west side of the road going from the road to the east fence.
8. There are no blocks with the numbers 1, 38, 39, 76 or 77 as these areas make up the front gate and the front landscaping.
9. As mentioned before, all layouts are in the same clock like formation and will all start in the southwest corner. The sections will start at the southwest corner of the block and then head north to the end of the block. Moving east ten (10) feet and finishing up at the southeast corner of the block.
10. The grave site numbers will also make the same starting at the southwest corner of the section, heading north to the end of the section moving east to the other side of the section and head back to the south side of the section.
11. Let's say that we are looking for the grave site of block 32, section 2, grave 3. Knowing that block 32 is under 38 the number will be found on the west fence. Going to the west fence, we will walk until we see the numbers 7 and 32 on the fence. Knowing the circle concept we know that 7 is along the fence going north and 32 is finishing the circle heading south, along the road.
12. Numbers over 39 are on the east fence and the same deductive reasoning is used.
