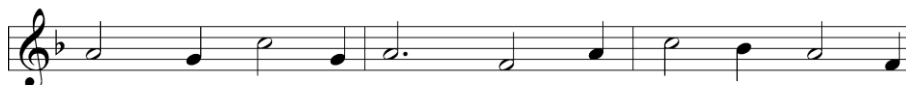

PRAYER OF THE CHURCH

✠ **Service of the Sacrament** ✠

The Sacrament of the Altar is celebrated today. As Lutheran Christians, we observe its use in accordance with Scripture and the *Lutheran Confessions*. We celebrate this Meal believing that the recipient receives Christ’s true Body and Blood in, with, and under the ordinary elements of bread and wine. Furthermore, we believe that this Meal is a “means of grace,” by which God imparts forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation. Historically a person’s participation in Holy Communion at a given altar automatically presupposes that the person is in *full* agreement with the teachings held at that

congregation. Consequently, we observe the historic Christian practice (dating from the 1st Century) known as “Closed Communion.” (See relevant Scripture: 1 Cor. 10:16-17, Acts 2:42, 1 Cor. 11:27-29, Ro. 16:17.) If you are a member in good standing of a sister congregation of the Lutheran Church–Missouri Synod and wish to receive the Lord’s Supper with us, please see our Pastor or an elder before the service begins. If you are not a member of a sister congregation, either our Pastor or an elder would be glad to visit with you about working toward your reception with us. An elder can be located in the church entryway. Thank you for respecting what we believe the Word of God teaches regarding this important matter.

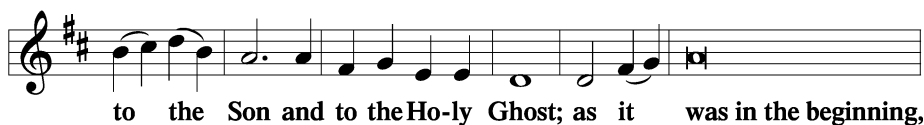
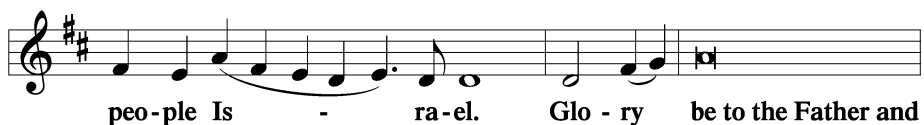
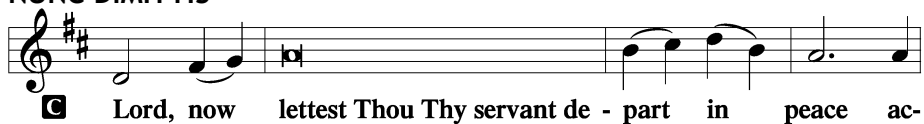

First Sunday of Advent: On the first Sunday of Advent, Christians light the first candle on the Advent wreath, which is often purple or blue in color. This candle is called the "Hope" or "Prophet's Candle," symbolizing the anticipation of the coming Messiah and the hope that He brings to the world. The Scripture readings and prayers during this week often focus on the prophecies in the Old Testament about the promised Savior and the expectation of His arrival.
