

OLD TESTAMENT READING Malachi 3:1–7b

¹"Behold, I send my messenger and he will prepare the way before me. HOLY GOSPEL Luke 3:1-14

- P The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, the third chapter.
- **C** Glory be to Thee, O Lord.

In the fifteenth year of the reign of Tiberius Caesar, Pontius Pilate being governor of Judea, and Herod being tetrarch of Galilee, and his brother Philip tetrarch of the region of Ituraea and Trachonitis, and Lysanias tetrarch of Abilene, during the high priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John the son of Zechariah in the wilderness. And he went into all the region around the Jordan, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. As it is written in the book of the words of Isaiah the prophet,

"The voice of one crying in the wilderness:
'Prepare the way of the Lord,
make his paths straight.
Every valley shall be filled,
and every mountain and hill shall be made low,
and the crooked shall become straight,

and the rough places shall become level ways, and all flesh shall see the salvation of God."

He said therefore to the crowds that came out to be baptized by him, "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come? Bear fruits in keeping with repentance. And do not begin to say to yourselves, 'We have Abraham as our father.' For I tell you, God is able from these stones to raise up children for Abraham. Even now the axe is laid to the root of the trees. Every tree therefore that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire."

And the crowds asked him, "What then shall we do?" And he answered them, "Whoever has two tunics is to share with him who has none, and whoever has food is to do likewise." Tax collectors also came to be baptized and said to him, "Teacher, what shall we do?" And he said to them, "Collect no more than you are authorized to do." Soldiers also asked him, "And we, what shall we do?" And he said to them, "Do not extort money from anyone by threats or by false accusation, and be content with your wages."

NICENE CREED

who with the Father and the Son together is worshiped and glorified, who spoke by the prophets.


And I believe in one holy Christian and apostolic Church,


PRAYER OF THE CHURCH

■ Service of the Sacrament

The Sacrament of the Altar is celebrated today. As Lutheran Christians, we observe its use in accordance with Scripture and the *Lutheran Confessions*. We celebrate this Meal believing that the recipient receives Christ's true Body and Blood in, with, and under the ordinary elements of bread and wine. Furthermore, we believe that this Meal is a "means of grace," by which God imparts forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation. Historically a person's participation in Holy Communion at a given altar automatically presupposes that the person is in *full* agreement with the teachings held at that congregation. Consequently, we observe the historic Christian practice (dating from the 1st Century) known as "Closed Communion." (See relevant Scripture: 1 Cor. 10:16-17, Acts 2:42, 1 Cor. 11:27-29, Ro. 16:17.) If you are a member in good standing of a sister congregation of the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod and wish to receive the Lord's Supper with us, please see our Pastor or an elder before the service begins. If you are not a member of a sister congregation, either our Pastor or an elder would be glad to visit with you about working toward your reception with us. An elder can be located in the church entryway. Thank you for respecting what we believe the Word of God teaches regarding this important matter.

For Thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever and ever. Amen.


THE WORDS OF OUR LORD






