Teach Your Children Values

Idea #2 List characteristics that are important to you.

Idea #6 Read Peter 1:1-11 Peter gives several qualities Christians are to develop in their lives. These include faith , goodness, knowledge, self-control, perseverance, godliness and brotherly love.

Idea #7 Read Corinthians 13. Paul describes agape love. He includes these characteristics: patient, kind, truth-loving, trusting, hopeful, protective, persevering, humble, meek, polite, unselfish, peaceable and faithful. This is a great list to review with your children.

Idea #8 Read Galatians 5:22-23 Paul lists the fruit of the Holy Spirit in our lives: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self control. These are the gifts the Holy Spirit gives as we mature in Christ. However, it is also possible to cultivate these qualities and to teach them to our children. Idea #11 List people you consider to be Hero's. What makes them admirable? Write down the qualities you value in each person. Are these values you would like to adopt?

Idea #16 Answer the following question: What characteristics would the ideal person have? After you make the list, rewrite it to be more realistic and practical.

Idea #24 Get together with friends and discuss the different values.
