Guests and Visitors – Brief Statement Regarding Communion

"I was glad when they said to me, "Let us go to the house of the Lord."

We welcome you to worship today as we celebrate the sacrament of Holy Communion. As we prepare to receive Holy Communion, we confess that communion was instituted by our Lord Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of sins, and that when consecrated, the bread and wine are truly his body and blood!¹ We also believe that every Christian is called to examine themselves before coming to the table, trusting in God's forgiveness as an answer to our sin, while truly recognizing the body and blood of Jesus, given for us. We further believe that Jesus has made the altar a place of *unity* – a place we are called to be in full agreement and reconciliation with one another.²

From scripture,³ the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod (LCMS), and Zion Lutheran Church, as a part of that Synod, understands unity not only as a matter of relational peace with each other, but public confessional unity as well. Your faith is a public witness, in addition to a personal conviction.⁴ To come to the altar for Holy Communion is to make a public witness that you agree with everything this church body believes, teaches, and confesses. If you are not currently a member of a church within the LCMS, that would be difficult to say truthfully, and though we make no judgment of your genuine faith in Jesus, the call to confessional unity still stands.

Our call from Jesus is to steward God's gifts faithfully, and to protect the church's confessional integrity, as well as yours.⁵ Out of love and respect for you, and in obedience to the will of God, please speak with Pastor before coming up to receive communion. If you are not receiving communion today, you are welcome to come forward for a blessing, or to remain in your pew as we sing God's praises.

Please come and speak with Pastor David after service for any questions you may have – even if you disagree with this approach – for this, too, is a good and Spirit-filled place for conversation! May you be blessed in our time together today as we gather around the Word of God in faith, hope, and love. It is good to be together in the Lord.

THE PASSOVER Exodus 12:1-14

The LORD said to Moses and Aaron in the land of Egypt, "This month shall be for you the beginning of months. It shall be the first month of the year for you. Tell all the congregation of Israel that on the tenth day of this month every man shall take a lamb according to their fathers' houses, a lamb for a household. And if the household is too small for a lamb, then he and his nearest neighbor shall take according to the number of persons; according to what each can eat you shall make your count for the lamb. Your lamb shall be without blemish, a male a year old. You may take it from the sheep or from the goats, and you shall keep it until the fourteenth day of this month, when the whole assembly of the congregation of Israel shall kill their lambs at twilight.

"Then they shall take some of the blood and put it on the two doorposts and the lintel of the houses in which they eat it. They shall eat the flesh that night, roasted on the fire; with unleavened bread and bitter herbs they shall eat it. Do not eat any of it raw or boiled in water, but roasted, its head with its legs and its inner parts. And you shall let none of it remain until the morning; anything that remains until the morning you shall burn. In this manner you shall eat it: with your belt fastened, your sandals on your feet, and your staff in your hand. And you shall eat it in haste. It is the LORD's Passover. For I will pass through the land of Egypt that night, and I will strike all the firstborn in the land of Egypt, both man and beast; and on all the gods of Egypt I will execute judgments: I am the LORD. The blood shall be a sign for you, on the houses where you are. And when I see the blood, I will pass over you, and no plague will befall you to destroy you, when I strike the land of Egypt.

"This day shall be for you a memorial day, and you shall keep it as a feast to the LORD; throughout your generations, as a statute forever, you shall keep it as a feast."

CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION

P: Lord God, on the night of the Passover, You saved your people, the Israelites, from death by the blood of a spotless lamb.

C: Save us and help us also, we humbly implore You, O Lord.

P: Lord, if You had only set the people of Israel free from Egypt that night, it would have been enough. But You stayed with them, kept them from harm, and freed them to be Your people, promising to always be their God.

C But Your people still turned from You. They failed to trust Your promises, and to follow Your ways. They did not think You were enough.

P: But You kept your promise to be their God, always. You did not abandon them in Egypt, or in the wilderness, or give them up to be destroyed. You have not abandoned us.

C: In the fullness of time, You sent Your Son, the spotless Lamb, to save us all from death by His blood.

P: Gracious Jesus, our Lord and our God, who takes away the sins of the world,

C: You bore our sins in Your own body on the tree so that we, being dead to sin, might live for righteousness. Guide us as Your chosen people to abide in Your mercy, seek Your will,

and live in repentance, always. In this life, lead us safely in the wilderness, and guard our hearts, until we are at rest in Your Kingdom – where, together with the Father and the Holy Spirit, You live and rule, God forever. Have mercy on us, Amen.

Silence is kept for reflection on God's Word and for self-examination.

P Father of mercies and God of all consolation,

C I confess to You all my sins and iniquities with which I have ever offended You and justly deserved Your temporal and eternal punishment. But I am heartily sorry for them and sincerely repent of them, and I pray You of Your boundless mercy and for the sake of the holy, innocent, bitter sufferings and death of Your beloved Son, Jesus Christ, to be gracious and merciful to me, a poor, sinful being. C Amen.


P: Do you believe that the forgiveness I speak is not my forgiveness but God's?

THE PASSOVER WITH THE DISCIPLES Matthew 26:17–29

Now on the first day of Unleavened Bread the disciples came to Jesus, saying, "Where will you have us prepare for you to eat the Passover?" He said, "Go into the city to a certain man and say to

him, 'The Teacher says, My time is at hand. I will keep the Passover at your house with my disciples.'" And the disciples did as Jesus had directed them, and they prepared the Passover.

When it was evening, he reclined at table with the twelve. And as they were eating, he said, "Truly, I say to you, one of you will betray me." And they were very sorrowful and began to say to him one after another, "Is it I, Lord?" He answered, "He who has dipped his hand in the dish with me will betray me. The Son of Man goes as it is written of him, but woe to that man by whom the Son of Man is betrayed! It would have been better for that man if he had not been born." Judas, who would betray him, answered, "Is it I, Rabbi?" He said to him, "You have said so."

Now as they were eating, Jesus took bread, and after blessing it broke it and gave it to the disciples, and said, "Take, eat; this is my body." And he took a cup, and when he had given thanks he gave it to them, saying, "Drink of it, all of you, for this is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins. I tell you I will not drink again of this fruit of the vine until that day when I drink it new with you in my Father's kingdom."



MEDITATION ON JESUS IN THE GARDEN

■ As they finished the final Passover and fulfilled God's promise of a New Covenant in Christ's body and blood, Jesus and his Disciples went out to the Garden of Gethsemane to pray, and to await his betrayal. Tonight, nourished by the same Body and Blood of Christ, the Lamb of God, we now wait with Jesus in the Garden, praying with him as we prepare for what is yet to come. In a moment we will observe the stripping of the altar, a symbol of Jesus stripping away his glory to come and live with us and die for us.

C Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus, who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross.

READING Matthew 26:30-36

³⁰And when they had sung a hymn, they went out to the Mount of Olives. ³¹Then Jesus said to them, "You will all fall away because of me this night. 
