## **Guests and Visitors – Brief Statement Regarding Communion**

"I was glad when they said to me, "Let us go to the house of the Lord."

We welcome you to worship today as we celebrate the sacrament of Holy Communion. As we prepare to receive Holy Communion, we confess that communion was instituted by our Lord Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of sins, and that when consecrated, the bread and wine are truly his body and blood!<sup>1</sup>

We also believe that every Christian is called to examine themselves before coming to the table, trusting in God's forgiveness as an answer to our sin, while truly recognizing the body and blood of Jesus, given for us. We further believe that Jesus has made the altar a place of unity - a place we are called to be in full agreement and reconciliation with one another.<sup>2</sup>

From scripture,<sup>3</sup> the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod (LCMS), and Zion Lutheran Church, as a part of that Synod, understands unity not only as a matter of relational peace with each other, but public confessional unity as well. Your faith is a public witness, in addition to a personal conviction.<sup>4</sup>

To come to the altar for Holy Communion is to make a public witness that you agree with all this church body believes, teaches, and confesses. If you desire to receive communion today as a visitor, please speak with Pastor David.

Our call from Jesus is to steward God's gifts faithfully, and to uphold the church's confessional integrity, as well as yours.<sup>5</sup> If you are not receiving communion today, you are welcome to come forward for a blessing, or to remain seated as we sing God's praises.

May you be blessed as we gather around the Word of God in faith, hope, and love. It is good to be together in the Lord!



C Forgive us, Lord. Wash us, and make us clean.

Like Abraham, we have not always trusted in Your promises but have taken matters into our own hands.

C Forgive us, Lord. Strengthen our faith.

P Like Jacob, we have deceived and grasped for blessings in selfish ways. Like Joseph's brothers, we have let jealousy and bitterness harden our hearts.

**G** Forgive us, Lord. Reconcile us by Your mercy.

P O Lord, Your Word is written so that we may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing we may have life in His name. Yet we confess that we have not always lived as those who believe.

**©** Forgive us, Lord. Give us life in Jesus' name.

P The same Lord who spoke light into darkness has shined His mercy upon you; the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob has now worked salvation through the suffering, death, and resurrection of His Son for you. These things are written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in His name.
