## Transitioning Back to School

Even when returning to a familiar setting after summer vacation, children usually feel a bit intimidated. They may have a new teacher, there are new kids in the group, and maybe a special friend is gone. Here's how you can help your child's beginning of school be as smooth possible.

You may want to read your child a few books with a "starting-school" theme. Such stories can help the child get in touch with his/her feelings about going to a new place and separating from you. Reading also gives the child an opportunity to talk about their feelings or ask questions about what to expect. It's a good idea to go over the daily schedule with your child, talk about what they'll be doing over the course of the day. Finally when it's time to leave say good bye, don't worry. We'll take it from there.

# **Get Them to School Every Day**
