#### Lesson Ten

## The Vineyard

Scripture References: Matthew 21:33-46; Mark 12:1-12; Luke 20:9-

**Memory Verse:** "And have ye not read this scripture; The stone which the builders rejected is become the head of the corner:" (Mark 12:10)

"Kirk, you have studied the lesson for today. Will you explain the parable of the vinevard?"

"Yes, sir. God gave certain responsibilities to the Jewish nation. Often when He sent prophets to them they rejected and even killed them. When they sinned the prophets tried to warn the people and teach them to obey God and bring forth fruit. As Stephen said in Acts 7:51-53 they rejected the prophets. Finally God sent His own son, Jesus, and they killed him. Since that time many Jews have suffered and most of those who follow Jesus and, thus are in the church, have been Gentiles."



"There comes the heir, let's kill him."

"Very good. Christians should not persecute the Jews. We should love them. But we can learn a lesson from their history. When people disobey God and reject Christ they will suffer. Of course, Gentiles (those who are not Jews are called Gentiles) will also be punished if they do not obey Jesus. Some are punished in this world as well as the next."

"Is there any way we can apply the parable to our lives?"


"Yes, I have just mentioned one — we must accept Christ instead of rejecting Him. The parable doesn't teach this directly but the lesson suggested to me is that when people commit a sin they often get worse

and worse. It's better to get caught in a sin and be punished and repent than to get by with a sin and then get worse and worse. So we must be

careful and repent for each sin and realize every sin is bad. We may start with something wrong that we think is not very bad and then get worse and worse."

"Our punishment usually gets worse and worse, too."

"Yes, that's right. We need to develop self-control. If we don't control ourselves someone else will do it for us and it gets worse and worse. When we are children our parents may spank

us or give us some other punishment. If that doesn't work our fellow students may ignore us and not want us around. If we still don't learn self-control our teachers or later an employer on a job may have to expel or fire us. If the government then has to punish us it may mean jail or death cell. But worst of all — if we don't learn to accept Christ we will be lost eternally."
