The Talents

Scripture Reference: Matthew 25:14-30

Memory Verse: "His lord said unto him, Well done, thou good and faithful servant ... enter thou into the joy of thy Lord." (Matthew 25:21)

"Ruth will you tell us the parable of the talents and how it applies to your life?"

"A man was going to another country so he called his servants and delivered five talents (a large sum of money) to one, two talents to another and one talent to a third. While he was gone the man with five talents traded and made five more. The one with two gained two more. But the one talent servant dug a hole and hid the talent in the ground. After a long time the lord of the servants came and had them give an account of the money. The first two were rewarded. Since they were faithful over few things he would set them over many."




"I'm taking no chances."

"The servant with one talent said his master was a hard man and he was afraid and hid the talent but would now return it to him. The master told him he should have at least given the money to the bankers and he would have its interest. Then the talent was taken from him and the unprofitable servant was cast into outer darkness."

"We learn from this that God has given us gifts, some more than others. No matter how small our abilities or opportunities we must use them for Christ. One day He will return and we will give an account of our lives."

"Very good. We notice also that if we use our "talents" they will grow but if we "bury" them we will lose what we have. That seems to be a law of nature — "use me or lose me." If we stop using an arm it will become weak or useless. Every normal person has some ability. Some have "talents" in things like art, music, mechanics. numbers. memory, physical strength or beauty, and all of us have been given gifts or opportunities. Some have Christian parents and friends, a chance to read the Bible, we live here instead of Russia, China, or some other unfortunate place.

ties and opportunities for Christ than if we are selfish or just try to make money. The same, or a similar, lesson was taught in the parable of the pounds in Luke 19:11-27.
