If I take this action, could it hurt my family? All actions are different, as are the consequences. And all families are different. But, what impact could this have on my parents, my spouse, my children, my siblings, my grandchildren? Will this negatively affect any of them? If I take this action, could it hurt the church? First, what impact would it have on individual members of the church? Also, how would this action reflect on the Lord's church as a whole? The church should be my first priority and I should never do anything to tarnish the bride of Christ. If I take this action, will others know that I love Christ? How would I react if I found out that a neighbor or coworker or family member decided to engage in this same kind of activity because they saw me do it first? Could this be a stumbling block?

My actions can hurt my influence...with a lot of people. I must be diligent to exercise self-control and to ask myself regularly. "What impact will this have on others?"
