Scripture Reference: Luke 15:1-7

Memory Verse: "... joy shall be in heaven over one sinner that repenteth, more than over ninety and nine just persons, which need no repentance." (Luke 15:7b)

"Jim, come look. We finally found Spot. He was skinned up a little but he'll be all right. Boy, am I happy we found him."

"I didn't even know he was lost, Peter. How did he get lost and where did you find him?"


"We took him out to the woods with us to camp overnight. When we started back we forgot he was along at first. By the time we remembered and went back he wasn't around. The whole family spent hours looking and calling. We found him caught in some barbed wire."

"Pete, do you remember once when I asked you why you didn't become a Christian? Do you remember what you said?"

"I guess I said why would Jesus care about me when there are so many millions of people — at least that's the way I feel," answered Pete.

"Do you think you are worth as much as a dog?" asked Jim. "You know you are, and a lot more. Even though there are lots of people, don't for-

get God is so great that he can keep up with all of them. He who made the stars and sand and everything is great enough to love all. He made us all different with different fingerprints and hair and teeth and everything. He knows the very number of hairs on our head and knows us all by name and loves us all. Jesus pointed out that a man with one hundred sheep will go seek for even one that goes astray. When he finds the sheep he will rejoice. You rejoiced over finding a dog - you love the dog. Surely you know Jesus loves you more than you love a dog."



"Yes, I see that but what about calling in the neighbors to rejoice?"

"Remember you told me about finding your lost dog. And in the parable Jesus was answering the criticism of the Pharisees. They objected to His eating with sinners. We ought to rejoice over sinners who repent. While we shouldn't be with sinners if it will cause us to sin, we should be with them to try to convert them. We certainly should be happy when one is converted. In the next few verses there is

another parable about some lost money (Luke 15:8-10). Jesus emphasized strongly in each parable that we should love lost sinners so much that we will rejoice when they are saved."
