Do you know my Jesus?

One of the old songs in our hymnals says, “Have you a heart that’s weary, Tending a load of care: Are you a soul that seeking Rest from the burdens you bear? Do you know my Jesus, Do you know my friend? Have you heard He loves you, and that He will abide till the end?”

The apostle Paul said, “I want to know Christ and the power of his resurrection and the fellowship of sharing in his sufferings, becoming like him in his death, and so, somehow, to attain to the resurrection from the dead” (Philippians 3:10-11). Paul believed that knowing Christ was the most important thing we could do. He gave up everything and counted it all as rubbish in order to know Christ (Philippians 3:8). He said that he would put the past behind and strain toward the future in order to win the prize for which God had called him heavenward in Christ Jesus (Philippians 3:12-14). It sounds like knowing Christ was something vitally important to Paul and thus should be to us as well.

The book of Acts focuses on the first century church and her activities. This great book in the New Testament points to the church as a “good news church” (Acts 8:25, 40; 14:7, 21). It was a church that sounded out the good news that Jesus had come to earth to seek and save the lost (Luke 19:10). The word gospel means good news. The first four books of the New Testament are called the “gospels”. (Matthew, Mark, Luke, John). They were written to tell the story of Jesus, and that story is definitely good news.

The good news recorded in the gospels tells the story about Jesus to help us get to know the Savior of the world better. Jesus is not just a name or a person. He is the Son of God (John 3:16), the Savior of the world (John 4:42), the substitute sacrifice for mankind’s sins (Ephesians 5:2), the light in a dark world (John 1:4; 9:5) and the bread of life (John 6:48). He is also loving (Romans 8:35-39), humble (John 13:1-20), understanding (Hebrews 2:14-18) and approachable (John 8:2-11). One well-known author said, “There is not a hint of one person who was afraid to draw near him. There were those who mocked him. There were those who were envious of him. There were those who misunderstood him. There were those who revered him. But there was not one person who considered him too holy, too divine, or too celestial to touch. There was not one person who was reluctant to approach him for fear of being rejected.” (God Came Near)

My prayer is that we can spend some time getting to know Jesus better to become more like him in our thoughts, words and actions. Walk with Jesus through the Gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. Spend time getting to know how he changed so many lives in the book of Acts. Walk with those who walked with him in
