

As we have seen in chapter 1, Paul emphasizes to the Philippians that God will finish the work He had started in them. He will accomplish this in them if they discern what is best and keep focused on living a pure and blameless life. That single focus keeps our attention on what counts and not on the difficulties. This is essential for the furtherance of the gospel. The answer to all our struggles is the gospel. Whether it is preached for the right reason or the wrong reason it is still the answer. If I preach it from a prison cell or in the market places it is still the message that all men need to hear. If we are right with God then all else becomes secondary. As we turn to chapter 2, Paul shifts gears from the focus of our minds to the state of our hearts. He uses the example of Jesus to challenge us to submit to God and to one another.
