No doubt you have heard some preacher say, "If you ever find the perfect church, *please don't join it*. If you do, it won't be perfect anymore!"

Since local churches are made up of human beings, saved by God's grace, no church is perfect. But some churches are closer to the New Testament ideal than others. The church at Thessalonica was in that category. At least three times in this letter, Paul gave thanks for the church and the way it responded to his ministry (1 Thes. 1:2; 2:13; 3:9). Not every missionary can be that thankful.
