Clasps his hands together. He thinks, "how's this for some truth, Pilate?" And throws his full weight against the stone.

Spring Hunger Campaign

This spring's synodical ELCA World Hunger appeal leading up to Synod Assembly May 31st will focus on refugee resettlement. This is an area of grave concern, especially now, and one for which Lutherans have long been known to provide assistance. From managing some of the world's largest refugee camps to leading resettlement efforts. These camps, sheltering those who have fled war and violence, care for persons facing health concerns after their long, dangerous—journey to safety, and who are in constant need of food supplies and water. Our hunger dollars are a way we accompany refugees through the uncertainties and struggles of trying to build new lives.


