Zion's News & Notes

A Few Words From Pastor Janet



The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it. John 1:5

Dear friends,

We are in the midst of what I think of as the candlelighting season. The days are short and so much of our waking time is lived in darkness. And so we find reasons to light candles ritually, more candles than we might normally—the candles we light on All Saints to remember those who have died, the candles on the Advent wreath and in home devotions, the candles of the mid-week Evening Prayer services, the candles of the Longest Night Service and, of course, the stubby individual candles we clutch to sing Silent Night on Christmas Eve. There is somethings about seeing the flames flicker that does something for us spiritually.

But this year in particular, many are feeling the weight of more than just physical darkness. There is the darkness of the ongoing wars in Ukraine and Gaza. A significant number of Americans are stressed about the future of our country, political divisions, economic uncertainty, and the dehumanization of others. The song that is providing a soundtrack in my head these days is *"Light One Candle"*.

Light One Candle, written by Peter Yarrow of Peter, Paul and Mary, and the Jewish son of Ukrainian immigrants, is a pacifist response to Israel's 1982 invasion of Lebanon but is now considered a Hanukkah song because of how well it speaks to the enduring hope and resilience symbolized by the Festival of Lights. Hanukkah celebrates the rededication of the second Temple in Jerusalem and the miracle of the oil that burned for eight days despite only having enough for one day. The song calls for the lighting of a single candle to remember the miraculous victory of the Maccabees over oppression by the Greeks, reflecting the broader human struggle for justice and freedom. Yarrow's lyrics remind us that light, even a single flicker, can push back against the darkness of despair, ignorance, and hate.

Light One Candle inspires us to be beacons of hope and agents of change, dispelling the darkness around us with acts of kindness and justice. The song's enduring appeal lies in its universal message of hope and the power of small, consistent efforts to bring about change, reminding us that every effort counts and that we must not let the light of hope and determination go out. The source of our light is Christ, who has commissioned us to be light for the world. Be the light in this time of darkness. Lend a hand to someone in need. Offer a listening ear. Contribute to organizations that work to alleviate suffering and hunger. Stand up for those who are marginalized or oppressed. Encourage others with uplifting messages. You might even listen to Light One Candle:

Light one candle for the strength that we need, to never become our own foe. And light one candle for those who are suffering, pain we learned so long ago. Light one candle for all we believe in, that anger not tear us apart. And light one candle to find us together, with peace as the song in our hearts. This Advent let us all be bearers of Christ's light and find the world to be a bit brighter.
