Great (and clear) Expectations, by Pastor Marie Duquette

I have just come in from romping in the backyard with Nala, our black lab (mix) rescue. She is six years old and has never met a ball she could not catch. At the parsonage next to Zion, there is a shelter house in the backyard. Right now, the roof of that shelter is covered in 6"-8" of snow. I was playing catch with Nala using her favorite orange and blue hard rubber ball. I decided to throw it onto

the sloped roof of the shelter, imagining the power of my pitch causing the snow on the pitch of the roof to cascade down, followed by the ball itself. I delighted in thinking that this would be a new, unexpected, challenge for Nala.

I threw the ball onto the roof, and it landed smack dab in the middle of the snow – and stayed there. Nala had watched its arc and looked at it longingly from below. I DID create a new, unexpected, challenge for Nala, one that will likely not be overcome until the spring thaw.

We all have expectations. We imagine how something will play out in our mind's eye. And when it happens just like we pictured it would, it's glorious! And when it doesn't happen the way we imagined it would, it's disappointing and puzzling. To continue to build the beloved community, we must communicate our expectations on an ongoing basis.

What expectations do you have of your new pastor and your covenant with one another? To continue this conversation that you began many months ago: here's what you can expect from me, for a few months anyway. Let's see how it works and review it after Easter.

Sunday: I alternate preaching & presiding at Zion and Trinity. Once Sunday morning worship and the fellowship events that follow are over, I'll be off until Monday morning.

Monday: Is my study day. I'll be reading and writing, answering communications, preparing and planning for upcoming events. I'll be doing this at Zion and at home.

Tuesday & Thursday - Herkimer, meeting with folks from Trinity and from the surrounding community.

Wednesdays & part of Saturday: I'll be in New Hartford/Utica, meeting with folks from Zion and in the surrounding community.

Friday is my day off. That gets me to about 36 hours, leaving a few hours for the unexpected.

I'm so happy to be with you all. Thank you for welcoming us to the Mohawk Valley. – Pastor Marie

Christmas Greetings from Germany



Edeltraud John, St. Oswald's historian, sent us these photos of her church at Christmas. In return, Zion emailed pictures from our celebration "across the pond."




