Sometimes when there is a baptism someone will ask about being baptized again, lamenting that they cannot remember this milestone event. I explain that baptism is more than just a one-time event and it is more important to remember that I **am** baptized than I **was** baptized. Unfortunately, many think that just being “done” is what matters rather than understanding baptism as the beginning of a new life in Christ. But think if you were to say “I **was** married” rather than “I **am** married.” It implies the relationship is now in the past. Being baptized means living wet; it means remembering every day who we are and to whom we belong.

Children are often drawn to the act of baptism by their natural affinity for water but, over the years, I have been amazed by what they absorb. Some years ago I baptized an infant while his older brother, DJ, looked on with close attention. Because he was so attentive, I explained to him in simple terms why I was doing those things to his brother. Several weeks afterwards, his mother shared a story with me. She and DJ were having spaghetti for lunch one day and, looking at the swipe of sauce on his face, she asked, “What’s that on your forehead, DJ?” Three-year old DJ, in all seriousness, said “That’s a cross, Mommy. You can’t see it and I can’t see it. But God can see it.”

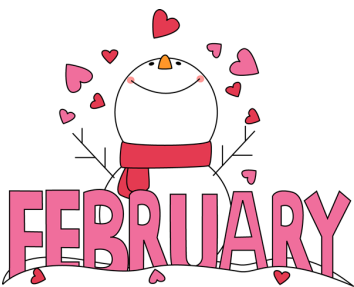
He won’t remember everything I told him—although he did an amazing job repeating what I had said—but I pray he never forgets that he, too, wears the mark of Christ forever.

One Lent, while working at a church in California, the associate pastor and I discussed what we would say during the imposition of ashes. I had never known anything but “You are dust and to dust you shall return.” He agreed that is what he preferred, but the senior pastor, who had just retired, always said the words “Remember you are a child of God.” At the time, that sounded like a cop-out, a denial of the reality of sin and death—and isn’t that what Ash Wednesday is all about? Now looking back on it, I see it very differently. Although I still use the traditional “Remember you are dust...”, I see the ashen cross as a way to make visible the invisible cross we wear on our foreheads all the time. Now for me that cross of ashes is a visible reminder that I belong to Christ, that my old sinful self has been drowned and Christ has raised me to new life.

Do I remember when I was baptized? I was only five weeks old, so...no! But it is far more important that I remember that I **am** baptized, that I have been marked as Christ’s own forever, and I have God’s love, forgiveness, and grace through Jesus Christ.

Lent begins this year on February 14th with Ash Wednesday. Come join your Zion family with worship at 6:00 PM !
