# Zion's News & Notes

A Few Words from Pastor David

Christmas day is now behind us and on January 6<sup>th</sup> we enter the season of Epiphany. As we look toward the new calendar year, I think it appropriate that I express once again, because I can never say "thank you" enough, my thanks to all of you for another great year at Zion.

Throughout the year you have been most generous with your time, talents, treasure, and prayers. Many of you have put in lots of volunteer hours not only in Zion related ministries, but also doing "ministry" and "random acts of kindness" out in the wider world. You have truly been God's hands doing God's work in a variety of contexts and locations.

We also started a couple of new ministries in earnest: the transportation ministry and the disabilities ministry, and financially, you responded well to the challenge of numerous building repairs, including an expensive new roof. In addition, you responded faithfully and strongly to the fall pledge campaign. We enjoyed an outstanding 60<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration of the dedication of our present building, upgrading the church's entryway with a Zion Historical Corner to commemorate the event. Our Sunday School teachers have been introducing our Christian faith to numerous youth and worked with them to put on a wonderful Christmas pageant. The council signed a lease for the YMCA to rent the lower portion of the parsonage, thereby providing Zion with additional income. It also voted to allow a congregation of Nepali Christians to "nest" in our church and use our facilities. For the second time, we hosted the InterFaith Matter's *Longest Night* service for those who find the holidays challenging. Throughout the year, the choir and Mary Senn greatly enriched and deepened our worship experience with their musical talents. We achieved our World Hunger goal of \$4,000 once again.

Overall, 2019 was a good year for Zion and it is to a great extent (we have to give some credit to the Holy Spirit J ) due to you, your hard work, dedication, faithfulness, generosity, and prayers. So, "Thank You!" one and all for the many and various ways you have contributed to and furthered God's mission through Zion this past year. Please know that it is very much appreciated and not in the least taken for granted.

That being said, I would suggest that Zion is poised for an even better year in 2020. Some of the seeds that have been sown in the past are beginning to bear fruit and our financial outlook is more positive than last year. We still have numerous things to work on in 2020 so we will continue to need your contributions of time, talent, treasure, and prayers. We will also continue to need people to switch from being passengers to crew members on this ship. I am, however, confident that these will happen. This is an exciting time and the Spirit is strong. Thank you in advance for cooperating with Her and following Her as She leads Zion forward.

Thank you for granting me the privilege of walking alongside you on both our mutual and our respective faith journeys.

# HOW LONG HAS ZION LUTHERAN CHURCH BEEN INVOLVED IN OUR FAIR TRADE MINISTRY?

We began partnering with Equal Exchange on October 26, 2006, so it has been thirteen years since we became involved with helping farmers receive a fair wage. We began by offering coffee, cocoa and tea that was displayed on a table in the Fireside Room after church on Sundays. Unpacking, repacking and putting the products back in the closet was a hassle and soon we had a blue cart with three shelves that was locked up during the week and brought out after church. Social Ministry decided to leave the cart out in the fireside room so customers could have access whenever they were in the church. Our next move was to some wooden shelves that used to house our videocassettes. Finally, in 2017, the hutch was acquired.

Please consider making a New Year's Resolution to visit our hutch monthly to find out more about Fair Trade and to purchase one of the many items that are offered there. We have olive oil, chocolate bars, chocolate chips, mangoes, dates, cashews, almonds, hot cocoa and baking cocoa, coffee and tea.

# Social Messages

### STORIES THAT EMPOWER: BUILDING THE NEW CITY:

LUTHERAN CAMPUS MINISTRY AND CAMPUS CONNECT TEAM UP WITH ABIGAIL DISNEY On October 11th Abigail Disney came to Syracuse where she screened Pray the Devil Back to Hell, her documentary on the "extraordinary story of a small band of Liberian women - Christian and Muslim united - that came together in the midst of a bloody civil war...and brought peace to their shattered country armed only with white T-shirts and the courage of their convictions." Prior to the documentary screening, Abigail participated in a round-table discussion with new Americans, city planners working on Smart City development for Syracuse, and Syracuse University faculty and students. She reflected on the discussion, commenting that as the community develops new technological initiatives, it should take the opportunity to develop a caring economy. The event was held at the St. Stephen Lutheran Church at 873 Dewitt Street in the North Side of Syracuse to encourage community-wide participation. The event was co-sponsored by the Northside Learning Center, Newland Center, and Hendricks Chapel. The students who were involved in making this event possible were inspired to show the film again - so that more of their peers could see it. A second screening of the film took place on Thursday, December 5th, at 7:30PM in Hall of Languages 207. The screening was presented by Campus Connect (the Lutheran Student organization) and the Muslim Student Association of SU with support from the Lutheran Campus Ministry and Muslim Chaplaincy. Thank you to Abigail Disney for being willing to participate in our Instagram contest! The details are as followed: First Step: Watch the Documentary, "Pray the Devil Back to Hell" Call Chaplain Gail Riina (315-251-4739) if you would like to have a group screening and discussion in your congregation. Second Step: Tell your story of the brave women around you who have done good deeds and fought for a societal cause or share any of their achievements, with the hashtag #lcmmcpraythedevil and tag @cusecampusconnect. Deadline to submit is January 21st. The person with the most number of votes will have their story read by Abigail Disney and shared on her social media accounts: Facebook, Instagram, and Twitter.

#### Roof Replacement

On May 12, 2019, sixty-two members attended a properly called congregational meeting where a motion was introduced and unanimously passed allowing the Church Council to spend \$68,600 to replace the roof at Zion. During discussion on the motion, the congregation was informed that the council had requested bids from three roofing companies and decided to recommend Dennis Padula & Sons Roofing and Sheet Metal Company. Padula was the lowest bidder, the most responsive to questions, and has done other roof repairs for Zion. In order to pay for replacing the roof, the Council will spend \$40,000 of memorial funds, and borrow \$11,600 from the Building Fund and \$17,000 from the Mission Investment Fund (MIF). The Council has decided to go with an "in house" loan of \$28,600 instead of borrowing from an outside source, thereby saving the congregation thousands of dollars in interest. It has also recommended a repayment plan and period for the \$28,600 (this amounts to approximately \$350 per "giving unit," i.e., a person or family) that will run from June 2019 to Dec. 2021. Each person or family is being asked to pledge to give an additional \$10.50 per month (\$2.60 per week) over and above their regular offering. If people would like to give quarterly, semi-annually, yearly, or make a one-time payment, that is certainly okay. In addition, those who have the financial ability to do so are encouraged to give more than \$350 in order to offset those who do not have the means to give the entire amount. FYI - people may continue to use their regular offering envelopes or use the green envelopes for special offerings. Either way, they should mark the extra amount they are giving as "Roof" or "Building Fund."
