Zion's News & Notes



A Few Words from Pastor David

Finally, the weather has turned nice, and as always seems to happen in central upstate New York, everyone's demeanor has significantly improved. That being said, I want to let you know now about a couple of special events in Sept. so that you can mark your calendars.

First, on Labor Day, Sept. 1, <u>beginning at 11:00 a.m.</u> we will enjoy our second outdoor worship and picnic at Kirkland Town Park, Pavilion #3. This is the same pavilion we used two years ago and has bathrooms and parking nearby. I will lead an abbreviated, informal worship service that will include me giving a brief meditation on the day's scripture lessons, prayers, taking up an offering, and Matt Aceto will lead us in singing lots of hymns. So, if you have a favorite hymn you would like us to sing, please write its title on the sign-up sheet that will be posted in the narthex at Zion. Please note that there will be no service of Holy Communion.

A picnic will immediately follow the worship service. The church will provide chicken salad, tuna and macaroni salad, potato salad, tossed salad, dinner rolls, iced tea, lemonade, water, and paper products (i.e., plates, napkins, plasticware). The congregation is encouraged to bring other salads, desserts, chips, hors de oeuvres, and other snack foods. If you have special dietary needs that cannot be met by the above, we ask that you bring food that does. In order have an idea of how many people we will need to provide food for, we ask that if you're planning on attending, that you please indicate this on the sign-up sheet at the church, or call the church office (315-732-4110) and we can sign you up.

Also, we have the pavilion reserved until 3:00 p.m., so people are also encouraged to bring lawn chairs to relax in and games to play. Families with children are especially encouraged to come and enjoy the rural setting. If you're having guests in for the weekend, we encourage you to bring them. We will have plenty of food, and worship is always better when we have more people and voices. By the way, since I didn't do such a good job with the weather last time, Ann McCarthy has agreed to order good weather for the day – mid-70s and sunny. We are hoping that everyone will come, enjoy one another's company, relax, play, and most importantly, have fun!

Second, I've spoken with Rev. Sharon Baugh, the new pastor at Hope Chapel A.M.E. Zion Church, and she has accepted my invitation for her and her congregation to come and worship with us on Sept. 22 at 4:00 p.m. This is a resumption of the plan Rev. Cary Beckwith, Sharon's predecessor, and I had come up with for developing a relationship between our two congregations. You may recall that they hosted us first, so it is our turn to reciprocate. Rev. Baugh will preach, I will lead the liturgy, and we will host a potluck supper afterwards. Since we're at the beginning of the planning stage, the music arrangements have not yet been made. I sincerely hope you will set this day and time aside on your calendar and plan on attending. We had a very, very good experience when Hope Chapel hosted us, and I'm confident the same will be true this time when we host them. The Sept. newsletter will include more details, but I wanted to alert you now, so that you can mark your calendars.

Roof Replacement

2019 Roof Replacement

On May 12, 2019, sixty-two members attended a properly called congregational meeting where a motion was introduced and unanimously passed allowing the Church Council to spend \$68,600 to replace the roof at Zion. During discussion on the motion, the congregation was informed that the council had requested bids from three roofing companies and decided to recommend Dennis Padula & Sons Roofing and Sheet Metal Company. Padula was the lowest bidder, the most responsive to questions, and has done other roof repairs for Zion.

In order to pay for replacing the roof, the Council will spend \$40,000 of memorial funds, and borrow \$11,600 from the Building Fund and \$17,000 from the Mission Investment Fund (MIF). The Council has decided to go with an "in house" loan of \$28,600 instead of borrowing from an outside source, thereby saving the congregation thousands of dollars in interest. It has also recommended a repayment plan and period for the \$28,600 (this amounts to approximately \$350 per "giving unit"; i.e., a person or family) that will run from June 2019 to Dec. 2021.

During this time each person or family will be asked to pledge to give an additional \$10.50 per month (\$2.60 per week) over and above their regular offering. If people would like to give quarterly, semi-annually, yearly, or make a one-time payment, that is certainly okay. In addition, those who have the financial ability to do so are encouraged to give more than \$350 in order to offset those who do not have the means to give the entire amount. With the above in mind, the council asks that everyone please fill out and return the pledge card enclosed in this newsletter. FYI – people may continue to use their regular offering envelopes or use the green envelopes for special offerings. Either way, they should mark the extra amount they are giving as "Roof" or "Building Fund."

Labor Day Outdoor Worship and Picnic Directions to Kirkland Town Park

From Zion, take Route 5 (aka, the Arterial) to the New Hartford intersection and follow the signs for Clinton (Route 12B). Take 12B passing Stewart's on your left, through the village of Clinton, around Millage Park, down to the bottom of the hill. At the traffic light, turn left by Key Bank and Tony's Pizzeria. Follow 12B past Hannaford's on the left, go past Clinton Auto on your right, then turn left on Post Street. There will be a sign saying, "Kohn Karin Park" or "Kirkland Town Park". Go straight, up the hill, and keep going until you see a sign on the right saying, "Park". Turn left into the park and take the first right turn. Follow the road around to Pavilion #3. FYI – Important park rules include: 1) no alcoholic beverages; 2) dogs must be on leash; and 3) follow all speed limits.
