A Few Words From Pastor Janet

Forgiveness is on my mind.

It's been the subject of a number of discussions I've been involved with lately and the topic of a Bible study that dealt with it from every angle we could think of. Who deserves forgiveness? What does someone have to do to be forgiven? What about when you can't forgive someone? What about when you can't forgive yourself? These are just some of the questions we tackled. And one of the most important things we learned is that forgiveness is a process, not instantaneous.

How important is forgiveness anyway?

For the Christian, it is right up there at the top of the list of characteristics that make us who we are-forgiven sinners—and what we are called to do—forgive as God in Christ has forgiven us.

Remember the very meaning of Jesus' name is "he shall save his people from their sins." Matt. 1:21

We often think of sin as a Lenten topic, but forgiveness as an Easter topic gets much less attention. And yet, in reading over the resurrection accounts from all the gospels, what struck me is that forgiveness was the purpose of what Jesus accomplished on the cross and through the empty tomb.

Luke describes Jesus helping the disciples to understand God's Word: You can see how it is written that the Messiah suffers, rises from the dead on the third day, and total life-change through the forgiveness of sins is proclaimed in his name to all nations. Luke 24:46

And then in John: Then he took a deep breath and breathed into them. "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive someone's sins, they're gone for good. If you don't forgive sins, what are you going to do with them?" John 20:22-23 The Message

It's two-fold, isn't it?

We need the forgiveness God offers through the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, not as some kind of ticket to heaven, but to experience a brand-new life change right here and now. And, having experienced that life change, we are to forgive others in Jesus' name.

That is the abundant, eternal life God desires for us and invites us to live. Alleluia!

I joined Zion as a member five years ago, but have only worshipped with you occasionally since I am at LutheranCare on Sundays in my role as Chaplain. I now am serving as transition pastor but, because I continue in my call at LutheranCare, many of you won't see any more of me than before. My time and duties are limited, but please let me know if you need pastoral care. I am here for you.
