Zion's News & Notes

A Few Words from Pastor Bill

As I compose these "few words" for November, it is still October. By the time you receive this newsletter it will either still be October....or perhaps early in November. In any case, I begin with a few words from Romans read on Reformation Sunday: "For we hold that a person is justified by faith...." We are "put right" with God by faith, and faith is a gift from God. Faith, not something we earn, but a gift we receive.

People of Zion, on Reformation Sunday you are again invited to a time for conversation as you look to the future, in faith, and seek to understand what this future might be. I think it is appropriate that Pastor Lori Kochanski will guide this conversation on Reformation Sunday. "Sundays and Seasons," a helpful tool for planning worship, shares these words as part of an Introduction to Reformation Sunday: "Rooted in the past and growing into the future, the church must always be reformed in order to live out the love of Christ in an ever-changing world." I am convinced, echoing words of Martin Luther from the Catechism, this is most certainly true.

It is true that our roots are in the past. On All Saints Sunday, November 6th, we will take time as we Worship to remember individuals who have been part of the Zion congregation and other people who have been important in molding us to be who we are today as individuals and as a community of faith. We are reminded that who we have become also rests in the witness of persons who "now rest from their labors". In this remembrance we grow into the future.

November also will be a time for all of Zion's faith-filled people to prayerfully consider how to live into the future. The time has come to think about individual commitment to the work of the church for 2023. God has promised that everyone has a gift from God to be shared... Prayerfully consider how you may utilize your God given gift/talent as Zion looks to the future.

And finally, while we may think about Thanksgiving and what that means in each of our lives, there are two other important days in the life of the church to consider. November 20th is the final Sunday of the Church Year – *Christ the King Sunday*. November 27th is the beginning of a new Church Year – *The First Sunday of Advent*.

Where has the year gone may be the question we ask ourselves. More importantly, I believe, is how have we responded to God's love and grace during the past year, and how do we hope to live in faith during the year that is beginning.

So much has happened in this community called Zion. We are gradually coming out of limitations put in place during the Covid pandemic. Worship attendance is increasing (more bulletins being printed), and we continue to be the community that worships in person and in remote locations near and far. Some traditions of past years are returning and new traditions are emerging.

Today and every day, let us not forget the on-going, continuing, need for people of faith to grow into the future as faithful proclaimers in word and deed of God's living presence in the world today.

I look forward to greeting you in Worship.

Social Ministry: We will once again be continuing our Zion holiday tradition with the **Angel Tree** and the **Mitten Tree**.

The Angel Tree will benefit the children at Thea Bowman Center. The greater need this year to help the children and their families will again be through gift cards instead of toys. The gift card contributions Zion has provided continue to be a lifeline for the families. If you would like to participate in this year's Angel Tree tradition, please send your monetary contributions directly to Zion Lutheran Church with the notation of "Angel Tree" so it is clear where the monies are to be directed. This year, members will also be able to take an angel off the tree which will have an envelope attached to it to make it easier to contribute directly to Zion and identify your donations for Thea Bowman. All the monies received will be converted into Walmart gift cards that will then be handed to Thea Bowman for distribution to the families. The Angel Tree will be going up after the November 13th church service, and contributions will be collected through December 11, 2022. Thea Bowman is deeply appreciative of all the assistance Zion has provided to their organization throughout the years.

The Mitten Tree will benefit The Center (formerly Resource Center for Refugees). The Center is especially in need of warm adult gloves. Handmade or store-bought hats/mittens, gloves, scarves will be collected through December 11, 2022. Children's sizes will go to Thea Bowman, and adult sizes will go to The Center. The Mitten Tree will also be going up after the November 13th church service. We ask that you place your items in clear baggies. 1 and 2 gallon Ziploc baggies will be provided for you to place your items in. Items can be dropped off Monday – Thursday during church office hours beginning November 14th, and also during Sunday inperson services. *The Social Ministry Committee members gratefully appreciate all of your contributions this year for the Angel Tree and the Mitten Tree*.

Holiday Food Baskets: If you or someone you know is in need of a food basket for Thanksgiving, please let Pastor Bill or Sara know. Contributions may be made by putting funds in a green envelope and designating those funds to the Zion Food Ministry.

Council President's Report

We experienced a most successful wellness presentation by Kelli Watson on Sunday, October 16th. Kelli's presentation was based on Jonathan Field's "How to Live a Good Life." She showed us a three-legged stool and demonstrated what happens if one leg falls off. All three legs are needed to live a meaningful life. These three legs were related to three buckets: (from Jonathan Fields) vitality, connection, and contribution. For the vitality bucket, Kelli shared food labels and emphasized that the foods with fewer ingredients are healthier. We also did some simple exercises that involved using all parts of our bodies. Some key traits from the connection bucket are feeling loved unconditionally, feeling strongly connected to friends, and feeling connected to something bigger than ourselves. Kelli felt that the contribution bucket should have the strongest emphasis. She complimented Zion on its contributions to our community. Feeling a sense of meaning in the ways we contribute to the world and feeling a sense of purpose are a few of the key traits from the contribution bucket. Kelli, thanks for a totally OUTSTANDING presentation.

Following the wellness presentation, we packaged 182 meals with our friends from Trinity and Our Saviour. These meals were divided between the Your Neighbors and Trinity's Feed Our Sheep food ministries. Many helped by providing food and packaging these meals. Thanks so much for all you did to make this another successful event.

On Sunday, October 30th, Pastor Lori Kochanski will guide us in another important Abide session. We will participate in self-selected small groups that will help us answer our focus question: How do we continue as Zion Lutheran Church? Please make every effort to attend and participate in our important discussions. A Zoom link will be available.
