### A Few Words From Pastor Janet

# Next to the Word of God, the noble art of music is the greatest treasure in the world. ~ Martin Luther

Music plays an integral role in my ministry at LutheranCare. Worship services and hymn songs come to mind immediately, but it enrichens Bible study when we close with the verse of a hymn and it often brings peace and comfort to the dying to hear a favorite song of faith. People with dementia who can't remember where their room is or that their parents have died, will confidently join in singing "Jesus Loves Me."

I do believe music raises our spirit and brings us closer to God, so I added a time of Christian music, playing songs off of YouTube. Sometimes it's an old familiar song but sung by a different artist. Sometimes I introduce a new song that no one else knows but me. I always ask for requests and sometimes it's me who learns something new. Sometimes the request is not an overtly Christian song, but I play it because it makes someone happy. Sometimes what I discover is a song that would never make it in a hymnal still has a Christian message.

For example, a resident requested "Big Bad John" by Jimmy Dean. I was hesitant, trying to remember the lyrics, but when we listened to the song, telling the story of how this big, fearsome man saved the lives of 20 miners, holding back the timbers in a collapsing coal mine to allow them to escape, before collapsing to his own death under all the rubble, I recalled how Jesus told his disciples, "No one has greater love than this, than to lay down one's life for one's friends."

Another example of this is "Lean on Me." I grew up with the Bill Withers' version, but the request was for Anne Murray. It was a song I never would have thought to include, but after listening, I said, "This is what our lives as a Christian community is all about!" Especially do I like this version that substitutes "faith" for "thing," recognizing that we have a communal faith. Isn't that what we mean when we say, "we believe" in the Nicene Creed? Faith is a living thing and sometimes is weak and sometimes is strong, but we have a community of faith to help us along. Sometimes we're the giver and sometimes the receiver, but we are here for each other, "to bear one another's burdens," as Paul reminds us in his letter to the Galatians.

Sometimes in our lives We all have pain we all have sorrow But if we are wise We know that there's always tomorrow Lean on me when you're not strong And I'll be your friend, I'll help you carry on For it won't be long till I'm gonna need Somebody to lean on Please swallow your pride If I have faith you need to borrow For no one can fill those of your needs That you won't let show Just call on me brother when you need a hand We all need somebody to lean on I just might have a problem that you'll understand We all need somebody to lean on Lean on me when you're not strong And I'll be your friend, I'll help you carry on For it won't be long till I'm gonna meet Somebody to lean on Just call on me brother when you need a hand We all need somebody to lean on I just might have a problem that you'll understand We all need somebody to lean on If there is a load you have to bear That you can't carry I'm right up the road and I'll share your load If you just call me.

There are so many different genres of music and they speak to us all differently, but I hope music is a part of your day and that it raises your spirits and brings you closer to God.
