My Daddy, The Praying Man

My mother and father were great workers for our Lord Jesus Christ and the church. They had a continuous prayer life which you could hear into the night. Praying for people to be saved, healing and many other needs.

When my dad began to pray, he had such a sound in his voice and movement in his body. His faith in God was so great, that he believed, without any doubt, that God would answer his prayer.

My first memory of my dad was his worship and praying at church. At an old-fashioned tent revival with sawdust on the ground, my dad slain in the spirit worshiping God. I remember looking at him with amazement.

I'm glad to say my dad was faithful to church service. We always arrived at least 30 minutes early. And most of the time, we were the last ones to leave. Before services began, you could find him in the prayer room, or up front at the alter praying.

My dad would pray with someone until they were satisfied. It did not matter what time he had to report for work the next day. Many times, I've heard him say: "The two places you should never be late for are church and work. You know what time they both begin, so you should never be late."

From all walks of life, people would come to our home to have my dad pray for them. I can truly say our home was a house of prayer and faith. He was often called to go to churches, hospitals, and homes to pray for people.

Miracles--I can tell you a few of them that I recall.

I was told that when my oldest sister was about four years old, she fell from a tree. Her arm was broken. You could see the bone all but poking through the flesh. My dad put her on his knee, held her close and began to pray. She fell asleep, but when she woke up, the arm was completely healed.

I, myself, ran a large, spike nail through my foot. Daddy prayed, and God healed it. No tetanus shot, or anything, but Jesus and daddy's faith.

At Sunday School, an eight-year-old boy, who was blind, asked his mother if Brother Embry, my dad, would pray for him so he could see. My dad and the pastor, other ministers and the congregation began to pray. During the service, the young boy pointed to Brother Embry and said: "Mom, that's Brother Embry. I can see him, and I know him because of his voice. The mother related to the church that, now, her son could see.

Another account of my dad's faith in prayer concerned a woman in the church, who had heart problems. She had fluid in her lungs and infection throughout her body, which made it swollen to three times its normal size. One evening, her son called my dad and mom to come and pray for this precious saint. When they arrived at the house, daddy went straight to where the lady was and began to pray. Her son related to my mom, that there was no need for Brother Embry to pray. His mother had passed away more than 20 minutes before they arrived. He had already placed a call to the coroner to come. However, Brother Embry continued to pray. In about another 15 minutes, she started to respond. She later said, she could hear Brother Embry's voice get stronger and stronger. And the miracle is, she lived 25 years longer. She went from church to church to tell of this tremendous miracle in her life.

My Daddy, The Praying Man

However, there are other things that must be done for the work of God. When you walk as a man of faith, truly sold out to the will and power of God, you may be called on to protect the church and souls.

I witnessed my daddy, praying with a person, that began to draw up his body into a twisted unrecognizable form. Voices came out of him that did not even sound human. The devil refused to let that man go. But daddy kept on calling on the name of Jesus for the devil to release the man. The voices were screaming back and forth. Noises and confusion began to change into tears, as the man repented and began to call on Jesus, himself. He became as a normal person. He continued to attend church and was eventually saved.

I saw this happen more than once.

On another occasion, daddy was praying with a man. He realized that this man was possessed by another type of demon. Daddy asked some other ministers if they would be willing to enter a Sunday School room with him to continue praying. He did not want the congregation, children and non-believers to be in the presence of such demons and devils. This type of evil could enter into such people. In the sanctuary, you could still hear the screams and cursing's of many voices. The ministers continued to pray. The ministers filed out. While the man, in his sound mind, and my daddy, walked out to the man's car.

There are many more healings and miracles that happened when my daddy prayed. Throughout his life, dad's dedication, determination, and faith, helped people to come to the Lord, and live changed lives.

My daddy, a man of faith, lived to see all his children and their spouses, baptized in Jesus name and filled with the Holy Ghost. As one minister said about daddy: "He's a man that sold out to God in all his ways. When he puts his hands on you to pray, there is such a power that goes through your body from your head to your feet."

This same power of Jesus is here, today, but it takes a person that has the faith and trust in God to do all things.

I would like that to be me. How about you?


